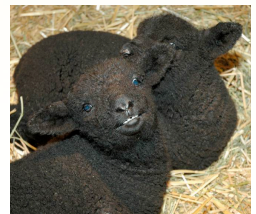

Anna is currently co-managing Healthy Harvest farm, a farm operated by Canadian Mental Health Association which strives to provide a low stress environment for people diagnosed with a mental illness to work, gain new skills, and produce healthy, organic food. The farm operates a farm gate stand, a CSA box program, and offers an online ordering service for local consumers and restaurants.
