Background

On May 27, 2015 the Board reviewed an application for a Temporary Use Permit for LOT 1, DISTRICT LOT 22, ALBERNI DISTRICT, PLAN VIP70566 located at 5771 Beaver Creek Rd.

The Board recommended that this application be furthered to the next stage of the temporary use permit process subject to:

- Written response from the RCMP with their recommendations;
- Compliance with the conditions listed in the Temporary Use Permit; and
- Written approval from the Beaver Creek Volunteer Fire Department Fire Chief.

On June 12, 2015 the Beaver Creek Volunteer Fire Department Fire Chief indicated approval subject to the following conditions:

- the ban on open fires must be adhered to;
- smoking is restricted and policed as per the plan;
- access for fire trucks must be kept clear of traffic at all times;
- adequate water pump cans/extinguishers are on site for immediate use by event staff; and

sufficient security personnel are present to enforce the above with zero exceptions.

The RCMP provided a letter dated May 22, 2015 that indicates: "The general plan and actions outlined within meet what is expected for an event this size. I do wish to take this opportunity to remind you that this view is contingent upon what has been outline being put into place. The responsibility for security remains with the organizers of the 'Five Acre Shaker Music Festival'. Although not required by the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure it is highly recommended that 'certified flagger' be used for traffic control on Beaver Creek Road".

On June 18, 2015 the applicants provided a letter from the Alberni Motocross Association that indicates that they will provide the use of their 1000 gallon water truck for August 14th and 15th. The truck has a water spreader to wet down event grounds and has a built in water pump with 40 feet of fire hose for on-site fire prevention and fire fighting. The applicants have also provided an email from the Port Alberni Port Authority which grants the applicants the use of the launch ramp at Clutesi Haven Marina to fill a water truck from August 14 – August 16, 2015.

Notification and Correspondence Received

Notification of the Temporary Use Permit was advertised in the June 16, 2015 issue of the AV Times, and notification to all residents and property owners of properties within 200 feet of the subject property was completed June 12, 2015. The signed correspondence that was received by 8:30am on Friday June 19, 2015 is attached (Appendix A) and summarized below. Signed correspondence received after this date will be provided to the Board of Directors in a hard copy.

My name is Kimberly Blake and I am writing to encourage you to please consider Mr. Goddards request to hold an event this coming August 2015.

I am in favor and in support of "all things Lance Goddard and Five Acre Productions", please let me explain.....

In the winter of 2013/14, My son Zakkaree and a friend Nic had a dream of planning a summer event, local event, local talent.

A place for our local youth to blow off steam and show off their talents. As they were together in a band called North by Nature Collective and had been playing locals venues such as the Rainbow Room. They last played the Rainbow Room Feb 28th, 2014......

While coming home from Duncan on April 6th 2014, my son Zakkaree was killed in a car accident.

While the family was still in shock, Nic and Lance Goddard picked up this dream and moved forward. Although Zakk and Lance had never met, they all shared this same vision. We continued on and found burgers, hot dogs, salads and drinks for sale. Along with vendors selling shirts and such.

There was a wonderful stage setup with dance floor and as a parent I noticed the garbage cans and cigarette butt containers.

As you walked past the stage area you came into this wonderful field for the campers, tents and trailers.

Security was everywhere and their moods were pleasant and calm and helped add to the

overall feeling of the event.

This was a well thought out and planned event and went without any emergencies or police needed.

It deserves recognition as a local festival. along with such events as Thunder in the Valley, Fall Fair or Salmon Fest. I believe it holds the potential to be an island event.

It brings in visitors, which in turn sells gas, groceries, beer, hotel rooms and meals at our restaurants.

As well as bringing in much needed local revenue, Mr. Goddard then handed me a donation. I looked all over town for a fit to that donation.

I went to the high school, mental health, womens center and family guidance but I just couldn't find the right fit.

You see my son was only 22 and would write music to release depression and the small public performances became an outlet. So I'm looking for that kind of fit. It must be youth and it must be music.

In the meantime, Mr. Goddard held another wonderful event..."The Halloween Shaker", and donates more money. So we have named ourselves "The Zattzoo Project" and want to fund local youth music programs.

The Zattzoo Project has held 2 events raising more money for this "mystery" program.

Well mystery no more...Thanks to Jess Towers. This wonderful person has come to us and is planning and putting together the first Zattzoo Project funded,

Port Alberni Youth Battle of the Bands,

The live music was unbelievable!! I was able to watch my friends and people I grew up with perform their music on stage in their hometown for the first time in awhile! I just read an article posted online by the AV Times about a resident collecting signatures to oppose the 5 Acre Shaker due to fire and noise factors. This is a classic example of the "Not in my backyard" mentality that possesses many of the Port Alberni Residents. Mr. Goddard has clearly done his homework to put on a successful festival, and to make it better for this year. He understands the liability risks and have taken many precautions, including hiring security and obtaining a nod from the Beaver Creek Fire department. It was very clear last year that he was hoping for this to become an annual event, with no intention of making it a one time deal.

The gentleman quoted in the AV Times article makes Mr. Goddard's event just sound like a typical Port Alberni Party when in fact it is not. It is **not** Mr. Goddard opening his home to a bunch of friends and acquaintances for a party that gets out of hand. He sells tickets, not only to benefit a cause, but to know how many people will be attending the festival. There is more planning than meets the eye that goes into an event like this, and Mr. Goddard has done it all.

There are many events within the City Limits that cause a "disruption" to the residents for an entire weekend. Anyone living in the Glenwood area can attest to 2 weekends a year (Fall Fair weekend and Salmon Festival Weekend) where there is increased traffic, increased fire risk, and increased noise as a result of the event. The Kinsmen and the Kiwanis have made these events better over time, and their events wouldn't be the scale they are today with the increased support of the residents of Port Alberni. If the Fall Fair and the Salmon Festival were cancelled due to a few noise complaints, and increased risk of harm to others during these weekends, we wouldn't have these events to look forward to. The alcohol consumption at the Salmon Festival alone puts many residents of Port Alberni at risk (drunk driving, mischief, general disruption), but the benefits to the community outweigh the risks. The noise from the Fall Fair often goes on past 11:00, and just the music being shut off doesn't necessarily cause the party-goers to go home right away, causing a disruption in the neighbourhood.

Mr. Goddard has put in a lot of effort to make his music festival a successful annual event and give the residents of Port Alberni another weekend to look forward to. He's not doing it to benefit himself - this is a fundraiser with an excellent cause.

My name is Kimberly Blake and I am writing to encourage you to please consider Mr. Goddards request to hold an event this coming August 2015.

I am in favor and in support of "all things Lance Goddard and Five Acre Productions", please let me explain....

In the winter of 2013/14, My son Zakkaree and a friend Nic had a dream of planning a summer event, local event, local talent.

While coming home from Duncan on April 6th 2014, my son Zakkaree was killed in a car accident.

While the family was still in shock, Nic and Lance Goddard picked up this dream and moved forward. Although Zakk and Lance had never met, they all shared this same vision. Lance then planned...."The Five Acre Shaker" of course I know he didn't do it alone, but it was his property, time and planning he extended, and it was well worth it.

When we approached as family, in the trees we could see, a wooden memorial to my son. To the right was organized parking and toilets, porta potties I guess.

We continued on and found burgers, hot dogs, salads and drinks for sale. Along with vendors selling shirts and such.

There was a wonderful stage setup with dance floor and as a parent I noticed the garbage cans and cigarette butt containers.

As you walked past the stage area you came into this wonderful field for the campers, tents and

trailers.

Security was everywhere and their moods were pleasant and calm and helped add to the overall feeling of the event.

This was a well thought out and planned event and went without any emergencies or police needed.

It deserves recognition as a local festival. along with such events as Thunder in the Valley, Fall Fair or Salmon Fest. I believe it holds the potential to be an island event.

It brings in visitors, which in turn sells gas, groceries, beer, hotel rooms and meals at our restaurants.

As well as bringing in much needed local revenue, Mr. Goddard then handed me a donation. I looked all over town for a fit to that donation.

I went to the high school, mental health, womens center and family guidance but I just couldn't find the right fit.

You see my son was only 22 and would write music to release depression and the small public performances became an outlet. So I'm looking for that kind of fit. It must be youth and it must be music.

In the meantime, Mr. Goddard held another wonderful event..."The Halloween Shaker", and donates more money. So we have named ourselves "The Zattzoo Project" and want to fund local youth music programs.

The Zattzoo Project has held 2 events raising more money for this "mystery" program.

Well mystery no more...Thanks to Jess Towers. This wonderful person has come to us and is planning and putting together the first Zattzoo Project funded,

Port Alberni Youth Battle of the Bands,

for youth under 25. It is happening May 15th 2015 and will have 3 celebrity judges and is bringing more than local attention. The winner gets to play at this years Shaker.

Footprints Security will be present as security for the event at a Ratio of 50:1, even though their recommendation was only 100:1. Their will be no smoking out of designated smoking areas, areas will be manned with event staff and a fire extinguisher as well as a moist non-combustible floor. The list of hazard prevention is way to long to write on here so i only selected a few. We are completely invested in hosting a safe and fun event for the community for years to come. Every Dollar Raised goes to the Zattzoo Project which is a local charity that

donates their money to Local Youth Music Programs. Every penny goes right back into our valley! It is only one weekend a year, this being the last at my property, we hope that the reward can be focused on instead of the risks which are present in any event this scale that happens in our valley (Thunder in the Valley, Toy Run, Fall Fair, Salmon Fest, Funtastic Slo Pitch Tourney, etc...). As far as I can tell from what I've seen it looks like this party is planning on being double the size of last year, and I believe, extended to 3 days. I am absolutely not in favour of this. Last year I was kept up all night not only by music but by announcers screaming and swearing into a microphone until at least 4am. I live on the corner of batty and Debeaux rd which is quite aways away but that did not muffle the sounds at all. My whole family was kept awake, and my kids had to listen to every profanity clear as if they were in my own yard. I understand the need for community events and I am all for them (I may be wrong) but my understanding is that this is a 3 day house party with 1000 guests! One night was bad enough last year so If that is the case and it is anything like last year I will be forced to leave for the weekend.

I've seen a lot of comparison to the noise of the fall fair, salmon derby and drag race events but fall fair and salmon derby are shut down at 11pm and the drags even earlier. I do not know all the details of this event but I hope that if this does go through (which I am not in favour of and quite surprised it is even being considered) that it is at least regulated like any licensed event and is shut down at a decent time. To Whom it may concern,

I am writing this to express my concern about the proposed 5-acre shaker event that is being planned for this summer. My concern is not with the event itself, or with the cause; it is the location that concerns me. I believe it is highly inappropriate to hold an event of this magnitude in such an area.

I currently reside at 5860 Mersey Road about 400 yards from the rear portion of the proposed site for this event. I have two very young children, one 3.5 years old and one newborn at 3 weeks old. We don't get enough sleep as it is and I simply do NOT want 1000 people partying in my back yard all weekend. Last year, if I recall correctly, the noise did not die down until well after 2am. That was with about half the people as proposed for this year's event. Good luck telling 1000 drunken revellers that they all need to quiet down and turn off the music at 11pm.

The other problem that I have with this event is the fire hazard. It's only the beginning of June and, if i recall correctly, water levels are currently sitting somewhere around what they should be for September; We are already on water restrictions. The weather is hot and dry and shows no sign of changing anytime soon. All it is going to take is one drunken idiot flicking a cigarette in the wrong spot and we will have a potentially devastating wildfire in a populated area. This event is simply not worth the risk.

To put this into perspective, I'm not just some grumpy meddling killjoy that never wants anyone to have any fun. To Whom it may concern:

It is troubling when people feel they have no say in the events that affect their lives. especially those things that affect their actual homes and the environment in which they live, where they have chosen to live and where they want to continue to enjoy the characteristics of that particular piece of heaven. When people want to do something that is not sanctioned by the laws of the that area, that would affect the lives of the people who live there and who have lived there for many years, it would be very hard to argue why those who are **not** affected should have the final say in whether the event will take place or whether it will not or **where** the event would take place.

We are a "yes" society. We want to say "yes" to our children in most things. We want them to be happy and feel self-fulfilled. 

To Heather Adair and the Regional Board,

We are very concerned about another five acre shaker taking place in our neighbourhood. There were complaints to your office last year and prior to his party your office let Mr. Goddard know that permits were required for such an event. For reasons of his own, Mr. Goddard decided to go ahead anyway, regardless of the risks involved, not only to his own patrons, but to his neighbours families and homes as well. He did'nt care if his actions bothered anyone else or ruined anyone elses plans. He did'nt care then, and by his refusal of the Fall Fair Grounds as an alternate venue, he apparently does'nt care now. His "vision" is to fence 1000 people onto a hayfield in mid august. The patrons are attending to support the musicians and listen to music. We do not believe they would refuse to attend because it wasn't held in a hayfield.

Last year we were bombarded by non-stop thumping noise from Mr. Goddard's party. After the two hundred foot perimeter it stops being music. As the hours wore on this became a " torture ", causing me extreme anger and resentment that I was being forced to endure this. Even leaving our home unattended to get away was not an option as there were groups of people walking the neighbourhood at all hours.

I was also subjected to an extensive " smoke-show " in front of our home, with trucks and motorcycles burning off their tires, and actual flames being produced from a motorcycle. There was a huge risk of fire in the tall roadside grass and of serious injury to the many bystanders had one of these drivers lost control. Bystanders had traffic stopped in both directions several times. When I called the R.C.M.P. I was told they had many calls already. When an officer eventually showed up most of the vehicles and foot traffic returned to Mr. Goddards party. In the morning I found several beer cans tossed over my fence. While we understand Mr. Goddard is in no way responsible for the actions of people off his property, this is exactly what I would like to address next. If this permit is allowed, Mr. Goddards solution to any patrons criminal activity, violence, public inebriation, destruction of property ect.,, is to evict them from his property. Evict them to where? Right into our residential family neighbourhood? We find that completely unacceptable!

We note Mr. Goddard's rule "outside alcohol permitted in campsite area only." 200 campers plus their guests plus their own after 12am. music?. Well that would still have to be better than last year when the invitation was open to all to bring your own booze. With vehicles driving in and out of the party all evening, I'd guess the odds were pretty high that there were several, at least, driving under the influence. Perhaps M.A.D.D. would have been a suitable charity donation for Mr. Goddard to have considered last year as well.

Mr. Goddard also states his company assumes no liability for personal loss,injury,death,property damage or other related harm suffered by participants,spectators,site owners,leasers or others who may be adversely

affected by this event. He wants us all to support his "vision" but if anything goes wrong, well then, we're on our own.

Mr. Goddard has known since before his last party that this is the wrong venue. He intends to hay the field and water down the property. Since we are already on water restriction, this would be a huge waste of water and would probably have to be done several times.

If we had bought our retirement home next to a ball park we would expect to see and hear ballgames played there. Next to a fair ground, we would expect to see and hear fairs taking place. We chose to live in a residential family neighbourhood, in the country. I was told your office informed Mr. Goddard that even if he gets the permit this year it would not be allowed next year. How could that be enforced if you allow it this year? And how could you deny anyone else that decides a party for 500 to 1000 people is a good idea? Where would it end? Why let it start?

When people attending the party last year had enough they made it all stop just by driving away, possibly to their nice quiet homes. We did not have that option. We live right here, we pay property taxes right here.

Heather Adair states in her report, Planning staff is of the opinion that this is not the appropriate location for this event given the proximity of homes, fire hazard risk, noise concerns, traffic flow concerns, and public safety concern with 1000 people being on a residential property. We agree completely.

Attention ACRD directors:

My name is Loren Smith and I live at 5890 Mersey Road and have lived here for 26 years. I am writing to inform you of my decision regarding the "5 Acre Shaker" to be held in very close proximity to my home. Firstly I would like to say that I commend the work and diligence of the two young promoters of the event. I think it is a great cause to raise money for and I'm certain the donated funds are very much appreciated. They have worked very hard and have done a lot of preparation for this worthwhile cause.

Having said that I must inform you that I am totally against this event being held at it's present location of 5771 Beaver creek road or any residential location within the ACRD. Having 1000 people in basically my backyard in the middle of the potentially driest summer season in the Valley's history is ludicrous and very dangerous. I have several points to bring up that explain why I feel my neighborhood will be negatively impacted, and explain my position. In

no particular order they are as follows:

1) I have lived here 26 years and enjoy the peace and and tranquility the area offers. Mr. Goddard on the other hand has lived at his residence 2 or 3 years and is asking the many long time landowners to put up with a second large party, which to me is a private business venture in consecutive years, when we were informed last year it was a one time affair, and was not called a music festival at all.
2) I own 4 acres and I do not believe I would have the room on my property for my house my shop,500 cars to park, an access lane, a beer gardens, a stage area, a food truck, a dance floor,12 porta potties, a EMT vehicle,1000 attendees, and 200 hundred campers, so I find it very difficult to believe Mr. Goddard would either.
3) I notice the ACRD staff has recommended against issuing a permit. Why would the directors have staff do the time consuming work of

researching this event and then disregard their recommendation?
4) It is quite clear in the staff report this event does not comply with the Beaver Creek OCP and is not a permitted use in this area, so

why has this application even gotten this far?

5) The applicants, by their own admission, have said that they must move next year as the event is too big for the present location. To me this shows clearly they are aware that it is a problem but are ignoring that fact at our expense, for their own private gain.
6) Also the applicants, again by their own admission, have said they have been offered an alternative location, that being the Fall Fair Grounds. This makes much more sense as the police, fire protection, noise, traffic and all parking concerns would be alleviated if they used this venue. The only reason given as to why they did not accept the Fair grounds is that patrons did not wish to pitch their Page 1

tent on rocks! I think a few bales of straw could fix that lone problem quickly! One has to wonder if there is a hidden agenda here that they want kept out of the public eye, such as business licenses. 7) The applicants also stated they gave 100% of the profits to charity but no financial papers have ever been made public. Does this mean that after all expenses and the promotional fees were paid to themselves for all the organizational work they did a little was left for the charity? I do not think people, no matter how strongly they believe in a charity will do all this work for no monetary reward. Therefore this is now a business venture first and foremost, and after an allocated amount of money is awarded to charity. I wonder if the government has any knowledge of this "Charity" as they would want their share of the pie I'm sure. No registered charity number has been produced to date. Let's call this what it is: not so much a "Music Festival" but a large outdoor party with beer sales for more profit. 8) By the applicants own figures they have a security to participant ratio of 50 to 1. I worked for many years in security and I can tell you from experience that one drunk person was hard enough to handle, two made it very difficult and any more drunk friends added to the mix made it impossible. One has to wonder how a single security guard could handle 50 or more drunk people who wish to cause trouble. I also wonder how a patron, after paying for weekend camping, can be policed on what goes on in his or her own private trailer or motor home. I don't think they can be policed. This leaves a multitude of scenarios that could happen with drunk people exiting their private RV's and possibly trying to start their BBQ that could get knocked over, or butting a cigarette on the grass etc.

9) I attended the PAC meeting on May 26,2015. The advisory council was convinced on passing the application. The chairperson had to be told how to run the meeting and what options were available at various times of the meeting. She seemed totally confused when a motion was made to accept and pass the recommendation on to you, the board of directors. She finally talked herself into seconding the motion, although she said several times that she disagreed with the number of people that would attend the event. So under duress, in a total state of confusion, she was the deciding vote to accept the application and pass it on to you. In a tie vote, as I understand it apparently with

the chair seconding a motion, it passes. Hardly a resounding

endorsement from the PAC. I notice the number of letters in support of this party. I also

noticed that in two instances there are letters from duplicate address which means the number of support letters from different residences is decreased. There is a letter from a landlord that lives in Nanaimo so he will not be affected at all with this party. One letter is from John Stevens who resides at Mr. Goddard's home and is a member of the Beaver Creek Fire Department which seems to be a conflict of interest and holds very little weight. One letter is from a family friend from whom Mr. Goddard purchased his property. Another is from the father of a family member who will be playing in a band at the event. Finally a letter from the person(Kimberly Blake) who directly profited from a donation. One has to wonder how much weight should be given to these support letters. Lastly I counted up the very minimum number of houses

that would be impacted by the outdoor event on the map provided by Mr. Goddard and doing a little driving myself, and got to well over 70, so 4 or 5 legitimate support letters from a selected hand picked few seems to lose all strength and legitimacy. I wonder too, how much weight should be given to Chief Councilor Steven Tatoosh's letter as I do not think Chief Tatoosh would be affected at his residence. Maybe the Hupacasath could host the event. I'm sure I can get several support letters for my cause from people who would not be affected by the "Five Acre Money Maker" but what sense does that make? The only sense it would make is that all taxpayers from the ACRD should be made aware that a similar event could happen in their close proximity so maybe letters should be written and phone calls from many people in different areas in the ACRD should be made to all directors to show they are totally against this application.

11) The noise problem is a no brainer. In their support letter the applicants admit to loud noise omitting from the property. This noise will carry for miles and be more than uncomfortable for many property owners no matter what sound man is hired. A live band on a stage in the middle of a quiet night cannot be muffled. If you have ever laid in bed and listened to a wailing siren, you can attest to the fact you can hear it for miles. The same case can be made for a gunshot or fireworks, so multiply those noises several times and you can easily imagine what taxpayers for miles around will have to put up with....

again.

One of my greatest concerns, probably the most important, is the one of a fire breaking out. We are in a record breaking month for lack of rainfall with predictions of the driest summer on record. I know there is no possible way Mr. Goddard can absolutely guarantee a fire will not happen. Although the Beaver Creek Fire Department has not officially stated they will attend 24-7, I wonder even if they do, what happens if another fire breaks out in the Beaver Creek area while the festival is going on? What takes precedence?How would taxpayers like the fact that their hard earned tax dollars are being spent by having a BCFD vehicle sitting at a private residence for an entire weekend? Although there may be a member of the BCFD on site, how does that help if a fire breaks out, when they are there with no equipment?Mr Goddard states the area will be heavily watered. Water restrictions will most likely be in effect, so are you to allow the event organizers to break those rules and water at will, while policing restrictions on the rest of us? Everyone knows a fire can break out at any time and place, and these odds are much greater with a group of people that are intoxicated. Imagine the odds with 1000 people wandering around with propane tanks and barbecues in close proximity. I am recognized as a disabled person by the government of Canada. I would have a hard time exiting my house quickly in case of a fire. Mersey Road is a dead end road. The wind is a prevailing wind from the Southwest which puts our exit right in the path of a fire which would make driving out impossible. We would have to try and outrum the fire, on foot, to the North through a wooded area. Would any of you like to gamble your life that you could win that race? I don't think so. To be perfectly clear we have no way out in case of fire. In the worst case scenario all the properties North of Mr. Page 3

Goddard's residence would be destroyed. I do not believe the amount of insurance Mr. Goddard has purchased would come close to replacing the properties that would be lost. I see in his proposal he has \$2,000,000 coverage. Speaking with my insurance company I was informed policies for \$5 million and \$10 million are available, but at a much higher cost. Does this mean profits are a higher priority than responsibility? What effect would an insurance claim have on me? Would I have to pay a deductible? Would I have to live in a hotel until my house is rebuilt? Who is responsible for my four collector cars?Can Mr. Goddard replace 26 years of memories made here? Can anyone replace pictures of my children and Grandchildren? Is any life worth the chance????Will the ACRD take responsibility for any of the damage that may occur? If so, will the directors sign a legal and binding document saying as much? Who from the ACRD, staff or directors, will manage this event or will it be left to the honor system? Will the ACRD taxpayers or the directors pay all costs associated with any and all damage that may occur?

We have three local businesses on our road and any fire could mean financial ruin to all of those well established company's. Who would compensate them? Mr. Goddard's insurance company, their own

insurance company, or the ACRD?

In closing I will sum up my thoughts. The applicants have been offered another venue that is a much better choice for many good reasons, and have not given a logical reason for refusing to use this venue. Why? They have not produced a registered government charity number or a single financial statement as to where the money raised this year will go or where the money from last year went. They have not finalized an agreement with the Beaver Creek Fire Department that I can see. They, nor anyone, cannot guarantee a fire will not happen. The applicants have mentioned the financial bonus to the Valley. Have they given thought to out of towners coming here for a wild weekend, who could care less about our valley, only to party as hard as possible and leave after doing what ever they wanted for two days not caring about any damaged they have caused? Although they have security (50-1) I wonder what would happen if a biker gang decided to attend, as they do to many festivals. Will their "professional security team", of whom we have heard very little, be able to handle that situation? Is the board aware there is a fish bearing stream running through

Is the board aware there is a fish bearing stream running through an adjacent property, and that 12 porta potties may not be enough for 1000 people meaning the creek could become contaminated? The applicants have hand picked support letters from 4-5 address from a total of at least 70 homes that will be affected. I have approached several of my neighbors only to find out that almost none of them are aware of this event being held, which tells me very little research was done or information made public by the applicants except for

their handpicked friends and fellow party goers.

There are a lot of questions the board has to ask or answer. There is a tremendous amount of responsibility resting on the directors shoulders, both morally and legally, on an application that should never have made it this far. One can only imagine how many more Page 4

applications, for any number of various events, in any one of the ACRD areas, will be applied for if this application is successful. The taxpayers will be watching. It would seem the only logical choice is to deny the application and have the event moved to a more suitable location, out of our residential area, which has already been offered to the applicants. Also, a class action lawsuit, should it come to that, could cost the ACRD a very large amount of money.

I love the concept. I appreciate the charity aspect, I am impressed by the work ethic and organizational skills shown by the entrepreneurs/promoters but I cannot support an event of this magnitude in a residential area within the ACRD boundaries.



"I never stated it was a onetime event," Goddard said. "But this time I can say 100 per cent that it will be the last time on my property."

Goddard said he has written approval from all governing bodies, including the RCMP, Island Health, the Beaver Creek Volunteer Fire Department and the Ministry of Transportation and Intrastructure.

He said the BeaverCreek Fire Department will have volunteers on site around the clock with first aid and there will be a professional security company that can handle the number of people.

Goddard was offered the use of the Fall Fair grounds to hold the event, but said it would be a <u>detriment to the festival's atmosphere.</u>

"It would be a big dust pit," Goddard said. "Because this is a music festival, it doesn't suit what we are looking for. It is also more of a residential area than my property."

He said he has done his homework and has enough room to host the event on his propertyfor one more year before looking into a bigger space.

"We have a vision for the future of keeping it as a festival in the fields with grass and don't want to taint that vision by having it on the Fall Fair grounds," Goddard said.

Smith is also concerned about the noise factor. "If you have ever laid in bed and listened to a wailing siren, you can attest to the fact that you can hear it for miles," he said.

Although Goddard said he has a lot of support from residents, including written consent from neighbours within 200 feet of the property, Smith intends to continue to canvass the area.




While speaking to an individual who contacted me regarding their support for my opposition letter, they bought up a very interesting comparison. They wondered if the director from Sproat Lake would permit 50 houseboats with 20 people on board each houseboat, which equals 1000 people, to be anchored 200 feet off her, or any wharf. There could be two houseboats in the middle of these 50 that would serve as a beer gardens. This would provide a total of 52 porta potties, (at least one per boat), so they could not imagine anyone would urinate overboard. By the way this number of porta potties is over 4 times as many as will be provided at the 5 Acre Shaker. Noise could be at a minimum as a soundman would control the 6 live bands that would play for two days and 2 nights. We concluded that the people who rented these boats would stay anchored overnight of course, but they felt the noise would stop at 12:00 AM because the security crew would tell the participants to be quiet at that time and all the boaters would of course comply. The fire hazard would be at a minimum as the houseboats would be surrounded by water, and smoking would only be permited on 5 of the houseboats. General boat traffic may increase as boaters from everywhere on the lake wouldbe running around to listen to the music and buy beer, but we couldn't imagine any impaired boaters actually running their boats home, in the dark, after attending the festival all day.

I mentioned to this person that houseboats have already been banned from all but one area of the lake, away from homes, sent way down Two Rivers Arm to an appropriate place. They could not help wondering why, as according to director Ruttan, it's only noise "it is no big deal". I promised that I would pass this person's comparison on to all the directors, as this could apply to all the directors who have a body of water in their areawhere this could happen, including Ucluelet, Bamfield and Tofino. It certainly is food for thought as a terrific money maker, for charity. Some entrepreneurs may call it the "50 Fathom Folly Music Festival" and put an application in to change the bylaws allowing this event. Interesting comparison.





Attention ACRD directors:

It would seem that Mr. Goddard has made a convenient error and not done his due diligence correctly as he has stated. It has been brought to my attention that several addresses within the 200 foot perimeter that the ACRD bylaw requires Mr. Goddard to approach and receive permission to hold his event, have not been contacted. Coincidentally these addresses that were not contacted are totally opposed to the event being held at 5771 Beaver Creek Road.

The homeowners of the following addresses within 200 feet of 5771 Beaver Creek Road were not contacted and are totally opposed to the event being held:

- 1) 5825 Saunders Road Simister
- 2) 5860 Mersey Road Simister
- 3) 5739 Beaver Creek Road Deederly
- 4) 5722 Mersey Road Anderson
- 5) 5695 Gordon Ave Bratosh

Using the map provided by Mr. Goddard and Ms. Towers in their presentation, the addresses were checked for legal size dimensions.

It seems 5785 Beaver Creek Road and 5820 Mersey Road to the north of 5771 Beaver Creek Road is only 188 feet wide which means the Simisters at 5825 Saunders Road and the Simisters at 5860 Mersey Road should have been contacted but were not. The lot at 5755 to the south of 5771 Beaver Creek Road is only 147 feet wide which means that homeowners, the Deederlys at 5739 Beaver Creek Road should have been contacted but were not. Also with these dimensions the Bratoshs at 5695 Gordon Ave should have been contacted but were not. Finally the homeowners at 5722 Mersey Road, the Andersons, once again should have been consulted but were not. As stated above all of these homeowners have signed documents in opposition to the proposed party.

The lot sizes have been confirmed by a local certified and licensed surveyor. This seems to be yet another spin of the actual facts or a



- 1) The applicants have shown no respect for the neighborhood, for the directors or for the legal process of the ACRD.

 They have already held two unsupported events
 (First 5 Acre Shaker and a Halloween Shaker) with no permits and with total disregard for the neighboring taxpayers.

 No apologies have been offered or explanations expressed.

 Even now they are only trying to do the very minimum to get the directors to pass this application, and they have failed at that. If this application is passed you directors will be not only disregarding those passed violations of the district bylaws, you will actually be rewarding these people for illegal actions. You also, will be showing no respect for the taxpayers who have sent you proof of overwhelming evidence of opposition to this event being held at 5771 Beaver Creek Road.
- 2) Mr. Goddard, stated in the text of his online support campaign, that the fall Fair grounds "taints his vision of the music festival". This is only after realizing his first response to the question of moving to the Fall Fair Grounds that "our patrons don't want to "pitch tents on rocks" made him look rather foolish. He could care less about tainting our neighborhood despite over 70 letters of opposition against the proposed event from the immediate neighborhood, including 5 letters from people within the 200 feet, the bylaw says he must have approval from.

He is quoted in the newspaper as saying he has lots of support from the neighbors, yet over 70 letters of opposition from those neighbors have been put in front of the directors. Having the festival at the Fall fair grounds almost completely eliminates the threat of fire as it is a gravel area. If the festival itself is indeed the prime interest of these people, I am certain festival goers will attend no matter where it is held.

Why wouldn't they? I can not think of a single logical reason. I can not find one person online who said they will not attend if the festival is not held at Mr. Goddard's property. I wonder what the real reason is that Mr. Goddard insists the event must be held at his property.

- 3) A prominent local traffic control company, has refused this money making opportunity and said no to the applicants, as the company management thought it was far to dangerous situation to put their employees into. This speaks volumes to the safety aspect of this event.
- 4) In the oath all of you directors have sworn to when you were elected, it states very clearly:

"I will faithfully perform the duties of my office and will not allow any private interest to influence my conduct in public matters;"

This seems very straight forward. This is a private application, for an event that is on private property. You are going directly against your sworn oath to the taxpayers if you pass this application which could have significant legal consequences.

5) In their proposal to the ACRD under section (f) Rules and Regulations the applicants clearly state:

"The Five Acker Shaker and Five Acker Productions assume no liability for personal loss,injury,death,property damage or other related harm suffered by participants,spectators,site owners, leasers or others who may be adversely affected by the event"

So my question is, if the applicants are not liable, for anything, who is? The directors or the ACRD taxpayers, most of whom do not want this event in this location? If every last detail is in place as the applicants claim why is that statement necessary?

What location or event is not eligible for an SOL?



- Private residence: An SOL cannot be issued for an event occurring in a private residence. This is because liquor inspectors do not have the authority to inspect private residences. A licence must not be issued for a location that cannot be inspected to insure compliance with liquor laws.
- Linemand premises: An SOL cannot be issued for a location that is already licensed (liquor primary licence, food primary licence, or manufacturer licence with an endorsement). The licensee of that location must temporarily de-license during the time the SOL is being held (SOL Policy Manual, Section 3.2). Also, an SOL cannot be issued for an event at a location where their regular liquor licence has been suspended (SOL Policy Manual, Section 2.6).
- Seathelian and bachelonetite partities: Such pre-wedding partites cannot be licensed under an SOL. Persons seeking an SOL for this type of event should be advised to hold the party at a licensed premises to ensure a safe and enjoyable event (SOL Policy Manual, Section 3.0).

If eligible, please have the applicant complete an application

If the applicant is eligible for an SOL, provide them with the applicable application form and have them complete Sections A. B. C. & D.

Events to be held in another area

If the execut is being held in another area, encourage the applicant to apply for the SOL through the BC liquor Stone in that area. Staff there are better able to advise on what additional approvals are required. However, if cincumstances make this impractical, for example the distance is too great or fermy travel is required, please facilitate the application as necessary (e.g., phoning the other stone, faxing the application, etc.).

9.7 Security, Door Control and Enclosed Licensed Area

At all events, and especially those held outdoors, the area in which liquor is to be served must be succounded by a barrier sufficient to confine the sale, service and consumption of liquor to a specified area. Access must be permitted only through limited and controllable points supervised by responsible adults. In addition to other reasonable security features, the entrance area where you check IID should be well hit.

In 500 or more people are expected to attend the event, a security plan must be submitted to the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch well before the event. The plan must include how the licensee will control crowds, prevent minors from accessing liquor and prevent over consumption. The SOL applicant is required to continue on the SOL application form if a security plan is required and, if so, that it has been approved by the branch. (If a licence has been issued but the applicant does not have an approved security plan when one is required, the branch or local police may cancel the SOL or take enforcement action against the licensee.) See Appendix 7 of this manual for a sample security plan.

If the special occasion has paid or unpaid door security, the individuals providing door security must be licensed under the BC Security Services Act. Door staff who will be responsible for preventing the entrance into the establishment of persons exhibiting aggressive or unruly behaviour or persons carrying a weapon or drugs and for removing, through means of persons or otherwise, persons who become unruly, aggressive or who present a safety risk to others in the establishment are considered to be "security workers" and are required to be licensed. Although individuals providing door security commonly check identification of persons entering an establishment and ensure that the number of persons within the establishment does not exceed the maximum allowed capacity, these are not duties that are restricted to individuals providing door security. If a server, bartender or individual checking identification or counting to ensure that the event is not over crowded is not expected to perform other tasks associated with the security of the establishment, that individual does not need to be licensed under the Security Services Act. Further information about licensing requirements for door staff can be found at www.pssg.gov.bc.ca/securityindustry/legislation/docs/licensingpolicy.pdf.

9.8 Other Licensing Conditions

9.5.1 Pre-sale of entry tickets for private events

For private events, licensees must sell or reserve entry tickets or invitations to the special occasion prior to the start time of the event (see s. 1 — Definitions). For example, if the doors open at 7:00 p.m. for a concert that begins at 8:00 p.m. all tickets must be sold prior to 7:00 p.m. in order to qualify as a private special occasion. Attendees may pick up pre-purchased tickets at the door during the hour between the doors opening and the event actually beginning and even after the event has begun.

9.8.2 Provision of food

As part of responsible beverage service, we strongly recommend that SOL licensees for both private and public special occasions ensure there is an adequate variety and supply of food and non-alcoholic beverages available, such as but dogs, handburgers, sandwiches, chips, juice, coffee, and soft drinks (see section 6).

9.8.3 Advertising

No adventising for a private or public special occasion is allowed that indicates that liquor will be sold or served at the special occasion. Text or graphics that cither depict or imply the availability of higher are

Step 1 - Determine Eligibility

It is the responsibility of the BC Liquor Store manager to ensure the applicant and event are eligible for a *Special Occasion Licence*. Unless the applicant has already completed the SOL application before coming into the store, time can be saved by asking these few basic questions to confirm eligibility, before the form is filled out.

Is a Special Occasion Licence needed?

- > Am SOL is meanifed iff: (SOL Policy Manual, Section 2.2)
 - > tithre llimmor will be scolld,
 - the liquor is being served (but not sold) in a public place, e.g., a mented hall, sponts field, etc.
- > Am SOLL is most meeted if the hippor is being served: (SOL Policy Manual, Section 2.3)
 - > im a private residence, occupied and used by the event host,
 - inn a private place (SOL Pollicy Manual), Section 2.3) and the liquor is not being sold,
 - by a licenseed categor and the categor will punchase, supply and serve the liquor. (Section 2.4.3)

Is the applicant eligible for the SOL?

Am apprilicant for a Special Occusion Licence must: ((SOL Policy Memusi), Section 2.4))

- > be 19 years or older and be either:
 - a BC resident, or a Canadian citizen, or lawfully admitted to Canada for permanent residence.
 - Iff moit, pileasse see Sitep 3 Approvals & Exemptions.

Important: The applicant must be in attendance at the event for its full duration. Under section 42 of the *Liquor Control and Licensing Regulation* the applicant cannot drink alcohol during the event.

Is this a family, private or public event?

There are three types of SOL events: family, private and public - it is important that the correct type is selected because in some cases different rules apply.

- > Farmily event: (SOL Policy Marrual), Section 3.0.1) An event that is attended by family and friends only (not open to the public) and celebrates an aspect of family life. Examples include weddings, birthdays, auniversaries, bar mitzvahs, christerings, wakes, reunions, etc. Bachelor or bachelorette parties are not eligible for SOLs. Events with a family focus, e.g., a neighbourhood block party, do not qualify as family event is entered as a private event on the LDB system.)
- Private event: (SOL Policy Manual, Section 3.0) A social, outbral, recreational, religious, sporting or community event or a testing to acquaint guests with the product of a winery, brewery or distillery. Attendance is limited to an organization's members, staff, and invited guests, as well as to ticket holders where all tickets were given or sold before the start of the event. If tickets are available at the door after the event has started, it is a public event.

Public event: (SOL Policy Manual, Section 3.1) Open to the general public, a social, cultural, or community event, e.g., music festival, sporting event, boating regatta, cultural and other festivals. Winery, brevery, or distillery tastings open to general public are public events.

Who can apply for which type of SOL?

Not everyone applying for an SOL is eligible to get one. Here are the four types of applicants and what they can and cannot host. (SOL Policy Manual, Section 3.0)

- Individual: An individual may only obtain an SOL for a Family Event. An individual may not be issued a Private Event SOL or a Problic Event SOL (see * below for an exception).
- Business/commencial enterprise: A for-profit business may obtain only a Private Event SOL and only for two types of events: staff parties (or similar occasions), and oustoner appreciation exents/special openings (e.g., a grand opening, a store introducing fall fashions, ant gallery opening, etc.). Attendance must be by personal invitation only -no walk-ins, and there can be no charge for entry or liquor. A business may not be issued of Fornity Event SOL or or Public Event SOL (see * below for an exception).
- Non-profit club, society or group: For example community groups, sports clubs, benevolent clubs, religious organizations, student associations, unions, theatre groups, etc. These organizations are eligible for SOLs for a variety of events including dinners, dances, meetings, concents, sports tournaments, club events, availab nights, parties, etc. These organizations are eligible for either Private Event SOLs or Public Event SOLs.
 ((Please see SOL Policy Manual, Section 2.4.5 Miscellaneous Issues, for additional information on other groups or genuine organizations which may obtain SOLs.))
- Marrufacturers winery, brewery, distillery: A liquor manufacturer or its agent may hold a tasting event to acquaint the public with its products. Tastings can be either private or public. If the event is held at a location away from the manufacturing site, please see SOL Policy Manual, Section 3.3. If the tasting or other event is held at the manufacturing site, please see SOL Policy Manual, Section 3.4.
- * An exception: If more than one manufacturer will be attending and providing tastings at the event, private or public, the host may be one of the manufacturers, an individual, a non-profit club, society or group, or a business.

Who is not eligible for an SOL? ((SOL Policy Manual, Section 2.4.3))

- Catteriers, event organizers, wedding planners, etc.: Persons providing this type of service are not eligible for an SOL. Only the event host is eligible for an SOL. (Businesses which provide catering services may be eligible to obtain a permanent Cotening Licence which entitles them to punchase and serve alcohol at the events they cater. See Contout Information.))
- Onganizations providing rental space: An organization (including a service club) which rents out its premises ((e.g., hall)) to others or which provides catering/bartending services is not eligible for an SOL. The SOL must be obtained by the organization hosting the event and the host must buy the liquor, bring it to the event location, and return any unused liquor to the BC Liquor Stone from which it was punchased.
- Businesses // commencial entemprises: From profit businesses and commencial entemprises are not eligible for an SOL, except as outlined in the section above.

Applicant's Intention: The applicant intends to hold the "Five Acre Shaker Music Festival" at 5771 Beaver Creek Road August 14th – 16th 2015 with 1000 people in attendance.

Options: That the Regional Board:

- 1) Consider denying a Temporary Use Permit;
- 2) Consider issuing a Temporary Use Permit August 14, 2015 August 16, 2015 subject to the following conditions;
 - Written response from RCMP with their recommendations;
 - Compliance with the conditions listed in the Temporary Use Permit.

Recommendation: That the Regional Board:

1) Consider denying a Temporary Use Permit;

Procedure:

Prior to the issuance of a Temporary Use Permit, the Board must first pass a resolution to consider issuing the permit. Staff then notifies neighbouring property owners and tenants, and publishes a notice in the newspaper to afford the public an opportunity to make written or verbal submissions to the Board. At the subsequent meeting, the Board issues or denies the Temporary Use Permit.

Note: Should the Board consider denying an application, the Board's policy is to defer the application

and invite the applicant to speak at the next board meeting. The resolution would be: "The Regional Board, at this time, is considering denying this application. Prior to doing so, the Board wishes to offer the applicants the opportunity to present their own case as to why this matter should not be denied".

Observations:

1. Property Description: This is a 5.41 acre parcel of land that contains a house and a garage at the front of the property which is accessed from Beaver Creek Rd. The front and back portions of the property are cleared with the middle portion of the property being forested.

2. Services:

- Sewage Disposal: 12 porta potties in addition to the on-site septic for the single family dwelling on this property.
- (b) Water Supply: Beaver Creek Water System. Water will be provided for hand washing stations at food vendor sites and near porta potties. Bottled drinking water will also be sold on site.
- (c) Fire Protection: Within Beaver Creek Fire Protection Area. The applicant has indicated that they have had preliminary discussions regarding fire risk with the Beaver Creek Volunteer Fire Department (BCVFD). The applicant also outlined that they will have First Aid attendants available and would consider renting an Emergency Medical Transport (EMT) vehicle.
- Access: This property is accessed off of Beaver Creek Road.

 (e) Parking: The applicant has indicated that they will provide 500 parking spaces on site.
- 3. Existing Planning Documents Affecting the Site:
 - A. **Agricultural Land Reserve**: Not within the ALR.
 - **B.** Official Community Plan: The Beaver Creek Official Community Plan (OCP) designates this property as "Residential Use". The objective of the Residential Use designation is to allow a range of housing options within the plan area.

The proposed music festival does not comply with the Beaver Creek OCP. Policy 3.2.10 of the Beaver Creek OCP allows for temporary use permits to be considered in appropriate areas in all land-use designations, in accordance with Section 921 of the Local Government Act (LGA).

A. **Zoning:** The property is zoned Small Holdings (A1) District. This district provides for intensive farming, truck gardening, orchard or nursery cultivation, greenhouses and other intensive rural uses.

Music Festival is not a permitted use in this zone.

Under Section 921 of the *Local Government Act*, the Regional District may issue a Temporary Use Permit, by resolution, in areas where areas are designated in an Official Community Plan. A Temporary Use Permit may do one or more of the following:

- i. Allow a use not permitted under the Zoning Bylaw;
- ii. Specify conditions under which the temporary use may be carried;
- iii. Allow and regulate the construction of buildings or structures in respect of the use for which the permit is issued.

Where a temporary use permit is designated in an OCP, the Regional District must give notice to the public in accordance with the requirements of the *Act* which includes notifying the neighbouring property owners and tenants, and publishing a notice in the newspaper.

B. Temporary Use Permit:

The Temporary Commercial Use Permit for LOT 1, DISTRICT LOT 22, ALBERNI DISTRICT, VIP70566, 5771 Beaver Creek Road shall be subject to the following conditions:

- 1. This permit is only applicable to LOT 1, DISTRICT LOT 22, ALBERNI DISTRICT, VIP70566, 5771 Beaver Creek Road;
- 2. This permit is issued for a music festival from 5pm Friday, August 14, 2015 through 2pm on Sunday, August 16, 2015;
- 3. Music is allowed on Friday, August 14th from 5pm 12am, and Saturday from noon 12am. No music on Sunday;
- 4. First Aid personnel must be on site at all times during the event;

 5. Confirmation from the Fire Chief that fire risk has been adequately planned for;

 No camp fires or open flames permitted;
 - Drinking water and hand washing stations to be supplied for participants during the event;
 - Professional Security personnel to be on site 24 hours a day at a ratio of 50:1;
 Six foot construction fence will be erected around festival area for security;
 - 10. Twelve porta potties to be supplied and serviced daily;
 - 11. Compliance with the Liquor Control and Licensing Act;
 - 12. Garbage and recycling will be removed from property immediately after the event concludes;
 - 13. A maximum of 500 parking spaces to be provided on site;
 - 14. No parking on Beaver Creek Road;
 - 15. Supply adequate traffic control as per Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure recommendations;
- 16. A maximum of 1000 participants per day;
 17. Compliance with recommendations provided by RCMP; and
 - Food vendors permitted with a 'Temporary Food Service Permit' issued through VIHA.

Comments:

The Five Acre Shaker is a music festival that aims to showcase local talent while raising money for local charities. The applicant indicates that music festivals are becoming a popular theme for communities to embrace as they stimulate the economy through sales in gas, hotels, food and drinks. The applicants have stated that the 2015 event will be an all-ages event with liquor being sold at the event by way of a "Special Occasion Licence". Approximately 500 parking spaces are available and 50 campsites available with 200 campers in total. Outside alcohol will be permitted at campsites.

The Five Acre Shaker Music Festival began in 2014 with approximately 500 participants per day at 5771 Beaver Creek Road during the August 8th – 10th weekend. The 2014 music festival was held without a permit from the Alberni Clayoquot Regional District (ACRD). Prior to the 2014 event the ACRD fielded calls from neighbours who were concerned with fire hazard, noise, and animal safety. After the event the ACRD received two noise complaints and the RCMP indicated that they received several noise complaints, traffic complaints, and one dropped 911 call from the property. RCMP indicated that they

had an extra officer on duty as "Thunder in the Valley" event was on the same weekend. RCMP indicated that this officer allocated more time to the music festival over the "Thunder in the Valley" event.

The application includes a letter from the Vancouver Island Health Authority that states "all noted public health concerns have been addressed", signed by Katie McNamara (Environmental Health Officer). Ministry of Transportation provided an email that indicated approval for the proposed event subject to:

- No parking allowed on Beaver Creek Road, all parking to be on-site;
- Adequate traffic control will be required on Beaver Creek Road including, but not limited to, flag
 person(s) with high visibility vests and traffic control paddles plus signage;
- Notification of Emergency and Road Maintenance Services (RCMP, Fire Department, Ambulance, EMCON); and
- All debris and garbage is to be removed immediately after the event.

Also included with the application is a quote for 'Special Events Liability' Insurance.

The application included nine signed letters of support from the owners and occupiers of property immediately adjacent to 5771 Beaver Creek Road. A letter of support was included from Kimberley Blake, mother of Zakkaree, who was killed in a car accident and whose memory the "Five Acre Shaker" honors. A letter has also been submitted from Chief Councilor Steven Tatoosh of the Hupacasath First Nation which encourages the ACRD to consider the request made by Lance Goddard to host the "Five Acre Shaker".

The following is a summary of the Temporary Use Permit application requirements that the applicant has addressed:

Fire

- Site will be heavily watered
- Grass area will be cut short to mitigate flammability
- Large ashtrays to be available and zero tolerance to butting out on the ground
- No camp fires or open flames cooking devices permitted

First Aid

- X
- Volunteers on site for first aid
- First aid station and emergency vehicle to be established in a central location

Water

- Bottled water will be available for purchase on site
- Water will be provided for hand washing station at food vendors and by porta potties

Security

- Professional security group will be hired (24 hours a day)
- Festival organizers will work with security group to put together an in depth security plan
- Security to participant ration will be 50:1 as per RCMP suggestion
- Six foot construction fence will be erected to keep participants within festival grounds and the help organize the flow of foot traffic.

General Safety

- Area lighting will be provided for safety and security
- Staff/volunteers/security will be available for questions
- · Land will be cleared and detailed to accommodated foot traffic



The applicant has been in discussions with the Beaver Creek Volunteer Fire Department to discuss fire risk. Further discussion of the fire risk would need to be completed to ensure that the Fire Chief is satisfied that the risk of fire has been adequately managed if this application should proceed.

The applicant has not satisfied all of the Temporary Use Permit application requirements. Written confirmation from the RCMP that indicates that they are satisfied with arrangements relating to public order and security has not been received. The applicants have indicated that they have met with the RCMP and they are awaiting a letter in the next few days.

It is anticipated that the neighbour and general public concern for this event will be high. The event does not align well with the "Residential Use" in the OCP nor with the permitted uses in the Small Holdings (A1) District. The Ministry of Transportation has provided their conditional support, but the impacts of 500 extra cars on Beaver Creek Road will have a short term negative impact on this residential neighbourhood.

The Beaver Creek OCP general planning policy 3.2.10: consider issuing a temporary use permits in appropriate areas in all land-use designations, in accordance with Section 921 of the *LGA*.

Planning staff is of the opinion that this is not the appropriate location for this event given the proximity of homes, fire hazard risk, noise concerns, traffic flow concerns, and public safety concern with 1000 people being on a residential property.

X

If the Temporary Use Permit is issued a noise exemption from the Beaver Creek Noise Bylaw R1002 would be necessary as the expected noise from this event will not comply with Bylaw R1002. With an increase from 500 to 1000 participants this year, the traffic concerns will increase.

Introduction

"Events and festivals tourism is one of the fastest growing forms of tourism. They are becoming increasingly popular in rural areas as a means to revitalize local economies. Festivals and special events play important roles in destination development, image makers, animators of static attractions, and catalysts for other developments. Events have direct and indirect impacts on communities. They provide opportunities for participation, skills development, volunteering and social, cultural economic and environmental developments. Community events and festivals can attract tourists and visitors at regional, national and international level. Events help to capture attention and promote attractions and infrastructures. Benefits of festivals to communities can be extensive, particularly when the draw is from outside the region. Research shows that the more involved local people and suppliers are in terms of provision of services, food, beverages, and attractions, the greater the economic benefits to the region. Local vendors, artisans, craftspeople, restaurateurs, hoteliers and innkeepers may make a large portion of their annual income during the course of an event. Festivals and events have impacts that go well beyond what can be measured in economic terms. They contribute to the quality of life across Canada by strengthening communities, providing unique activities and events, building awareness of diverse cultures and identities, and acting as a source of community pride." The Five Acre Shaker is a music festival that aims to showcase local talent while aiming to bring a fun, exciting and meaningful event to the Alberni Valley. In its first year of inception the Five Acre Shaker raised money for local charities and was a well received by all ages. Music Festivals are becoming a popular theme for communities to embrace as they stimulate the economy through sales in gas, hotels, food and drinks, etc. While having a positive effect on the community, music festivals, give locals something to look forward to and gives the community an event to be a part of. This festival gives opportunity to show case the culture here in the Valley and gives Port Alberni an opportunity to host people from all around the province.

Proposal

To have the festival ground be located at 5771 Beaver Creek Road.

Location

Last year the festival was held on Lance's private residence in at 5771 Beaver Creek Road, Port Alberni. This is a **5.41 acre lot** that has both wooded and grass field areas (see appendix). There were approximately 600 persons that attended the festival each day. There was parking, a games area, a stage/dance floor area, food and merchandise tents as well as a camping area. There was ample space to accommodate everyone with the games area remaining largely untouched.

1. Health and Safety

a. Fire

- Fire concerns are to be dealt with by heavy watering of the site in the days leading up to the event.
- Grass area is to be cut down very short to mitigate flammability.
- Large ashtrays to be available in abundance with constant reminders from the Emcee on stage to use ashtrays. Zero tolerance for butting out on the ground.
- A blessing from the Beaver Creek fire department with all local fire departments being made aware of the festival.
- Emergency vehicles will always have a vehicle lane clear to access the whole property. As per the RCMP suggestion.
- No camp fires / open flame cooking devices etc. will be permitted.
- Beaver Creek Fire Department will be present for Fire and First Aid Emergency Services

. First Aid

- First Aid is to be provided by the Volunteers of Beaver Creek Fire Department
- First Aid station and Emergency Vehicle will be established in a central location on site

c. Water

- Bottled drinking water will be available for purchase on site.
- Water will be provided for hand washing stations at both food vendors sites as well as by the porta potties for the public.

d. Security

- A professional security group will be hired to provide security services for the entirety of the event. This will be 24 hr service.
- Organizers will work closely with the hired security group to put together an in depth security plan that is multi faceted in working in festival environments. This plan will include all recommendations from the local RCMP and will be strictly enforced by both paid security staff as well as volunteers.
- Security to participant ratio will be 50:1 as per RCMP suggestion
- Security will be equipped with walkie talkies to remain in constant contact with one another.
- Rules and Regulations of the event will be made clear and available to festival goers on the festivals webpage and will also be outlined when purchasing tickets as well as clear signage during the duration of the event.
- There will be reminders from the stage given to spectators of the rules and regulations.
- A six foot construction fence will be erected to keep participants within festival grounds and to help organize the flow of foot traffic.

e. General Safety

- Area lighting will be provided around the whole event premises for safety and security
 of all personnel.
- Staff/ Volunteers/ Security will be available to answer any questions anyone will have.
- The land will is cleared and will be detailed to accommodate foot traffic.
- Mill felt will be laid down in the dance floor area.

f. Rules and Regulations

- On site security is available 24 hours a day throughout the weekend. Lock up all valuables to avoid theft.
- Five Acer Shaker wristbands must be worn at all times and are subject to inspection. Any
 wristbands found to be altered, tampered with or fraudulent will be removed and the
 owner will be escorted from the site.
- Any criminal activity, violence, public inebriation, destruction of property or any other violation of Five Acre Shaker 2015 rules is subject to removal of wristband and immediate ejection from the grounds and possible arrest.
- Two pieces of valid ID (1 photo) required at all times.
- Parents please be advised underage drinking /contributing to a minor is a criminal
 offense, Police will be involved and violators are subject to removal or possible arrest.
- Outside alcohol is permitted in the camp site area only. Security will confiscate and dispose of alcohol found outside designated camp site areas.
- Show ground gates are scheduled to open from 5pm Friday August 14th until 12am. On Saturday August 15th the gates will be open at 12pm until 12am.

2. Noise Control

- The stage will be located in a forested area to help mitigate sound from travelling.
- The sound system is to be run by a professional sound technician that will keep the sound within reasonable decibels for the space.
- The event will shut down at the predetermined time in which time day pass users will be required to leave the ground and campers are to return to the camping area.

3. Facilities

- Porta potties will be rented and serviced daily by Walco Industries.
- Based on 1000 persons 12 porta potties is the recommended amount necessary.
- Hand washing stations will be made available for public use.

4. Garbage/Recycling

- A roll off garbage container will be rented for the weekend to deal with all on site waste.
- Garbage cans will be made available to public throughout the site.
- Campers will be handed a garbage bag upon entry and use of the bags will be enforced by volunteer staff.
- Recycling containers will be made available throughout the site.

5. Parking/Traffic

- Volunteers will manage the parking area insuring parking is safe and that access lanes stay clear.
- A roundabout will be established on the front end of the property to allow for taxis and
 for easy pick up and drop off as well as serving to re route people in the case of a full
 parking area. This will allow beaver creek road to remain clear while the event is
 underway. The roundabout will serve as an extra layer of versatility for traffic issues.
- Carpooling will be strongly encouraged through the event webpage as well as on tickets.
- A line of communication through social media sites will update participants on the current parking availability.
- No parking will be allowed on Beaver Creek Road, all parking is to be onsite;

Hi Jess,

Could you please clarify the status of the Beaver Creek Fire Department (with respect to Fire Safety for the event). As well as First Aid. You mentioned that someone other than the BCVFD would provide First Aid. Name and times this person will be on site. We have spoken with the BCVFD about the event and they have expressed interest in providing First Aid attendants and an emergency vehicle to be on site throughout the course of the weekend. Subsequently they're will always be members of the BCVFD on site to provide fire response should it be necessary. The fire chief is in the process of writing up a letter confirming their involvement. We had 4 individual members of the BCVFD come forward and state they would be willing to provide First Aid services in the event the BCVFD didn't come forward. In this event we would rent a EMT vehicle for the weekend to be on site throughout the duration of the event. Again, they're will always be members of the BCVFD on site to provide fire response should it be necessary These people are Dave Coyln (who's support letter can be found in the appendix of the application), John Stephens, Dave Cathers and Kerria Frechette. There will be two First aiders on the grounds at all times.

When I met with Lance today he indicated that he was thinking that there would be about 200 campers but unsure how many campsite would be made available. Could you please confirm the number of campers and campsites. 200 campers is accurate to the amount of space that we've allotted for camping. We would designate 50 campsites which works out to 4 person per site (on average). The camping area is 4500 sq m. In the ACRD bylaw manual the minimum size for a camping site is 55 sq m.

4500/55sq m. = 81 campsites

This will allow room for sufficient road access to all campsites as per RCMP recommendation.

Comments:

The Five Acre Shaker is a music festival that aims to showcase local talent while raising money for local charities. The applicant indicates that music festivals are becoming a popular theme for communities to embrace as they stimulate the economy through sales in gas, hotels, food and drinks. The applicants have stated that the 2015 event will be an all-ages event with liquor being sold at the event by way of a "Special Occasion Licence". Approximately 500 parking spaces are available and 50 campsites available with 200 campers in total. Outside alcohol will be permitted at campsites.

The Five Acre Shaker Music Festival began in 2014 with approximately 500 participants per day at 5771 Beaver Creek Road during the August 8th – 10th weekend. The 2014 music festival was held without a permit from the Alberni Clayoquot Regional District (ACRD). Prior to the 2014 event the ACRD fielded calls from neighbours who were concerned with fire hazard, noise, and animal safety. After the event the ACRD received two noise complaints and the RCMP indicated that they received several noise complaints, and one dropped 911 call from the property. RCMP indicated that they

More specifically, would you be able to review the Fire and Safety Management section of our proposal to ensure that you are satisfied that the risk of fire has been adequately managed for this event. This can be done via email or letterhead. If you don't feel that the fire and safety risk plan has been adequately managed, we are more than obliged to take any recommendations and include them in our fire risk management plan.
