## Re: Float Homes in Tla-o-qui-aht Haahuulthii

This letter is to request support from the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District in addressing a pressing issue for our Nation. Tla-o-qui-aht is concerned that float-homes continue to be built and/or launched locally, only to be illegally anchored and located in our waters without consultation.

No float-home or flotilla should be created locally, nor should it be launched here, unless it is associated with a legal foreshore permit. It is foreseeable that aquaculture tenures may require some sort of structures located on-site, but this does not negate the duty to consult either.

We would like to seek ACRD support in restricting any construction of float-homes and/or launching of float-homes in the Region. This includes all marinas in the District of Tofino, the Grice Bay Boat Launch, and all other fresh water boat launches in Kennedy Lake.

There are many outstanding issues with the current float-homes that are illegally located in the Tla-o-qui-aht Haahuulthii. Many float-homes are located in the same safe harbours that are suitable for Clam-Digging. Some float-homes are located above productive eel grass. There are concerns that without a comprehensive management plan for these homes/cabins, the industry will negatively impact our aboriginal interests in our Haahuulthii.

Furthermore, not a single float home has an operating protocol with our Nation. A number of years ago, the province met with the local float-home-association, whilst TFN was in the process of working on Marine Spatial planning, and demanded that float homes pay a fee to BC and not to TFN. This remains an outstanding issue between our Nation and the province of BC. We seek your support in working towards solutions to this industry/land-use.

#### Fuels management project initiated in Powell River

PARKSVILLE – The Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations is undertaking a fuels management treatment project within the City of Powell River to reduce forest fuels near the Penticton Trails.

Trees and brush in the popular trail network will be thinned and pruned, starting Monday, March 21, 2016. The resulting piles of debris will be chipped for disposal.

This collaborative project between the BC Wildfire Service and the City of Powell River will help reduce the likelihood of a high-intensity wildfire in this forested area, which is right next to a residential subdivision. It will slow the spread of any future wildfire by reducing the number of embers that would be carried aloft and it will create a more easily defended space where firefighters could work.

When this project is completed, it will serve as a demonstration of effective fuel treatments that local homeowners can apply to their own properties to reduce wildfire threats locally. The Powell River project is also a good example of how communities can partner with BC Wildfire Service crews to undertake fuel management treatments.

Wildfire prevention is a shared responsibility of the B.C. government, industry stakeholders, local governments, First Nations and private landowners. RE: Regional District Grant Agreement Dated August 13, 2014 between the Regional District of Nanaimo and Island Corridor Foundation (the "Grant Agreement")

On August 13, 2014, the Regional District of Nanaimo ("Regional District") and the Island Corridor Foundation ("ICF") executed the Grant Agreement to document the Regional District's commitment to provide funding in 2014 and 2015 to ICF to permit ICF to carry out rail infrastructure improvements.

ICF has never provided the Regional District with the budget contemplated by section 5.1 of the Grant Agreement, and failed to tender the project in 2014 as contemplated by section 6.1(c) of the Grant Agreement. Nor was the project tendered in 2015. The Regional District notes that it has no obligation under the Grant Agreement to provide any part of its contribution after 2015.

The Regional District is very disappointed that the project for which public funds were committed has not been able to move forward.

The Regional District considers that as a result of ICF's failure to provide the Regional District with the anticipated budget and to proceed with the tendering and award of the project as set out in the Grant Agreement, the ICF is in breach of the Grant Agreement.

Accordingly, the Regional District hereby gives notice under section 11.1 of the Grant Agreement that it is exercising its right of termination of the Grant Agreement effective 60 days from the date of this notice.

In any event, this notice is given without prejudice to the right of the Regional District to take the position that ICF is in a fundamental breach of the Grant Agreement which would eliminate the need for notice in any event.

The Regional District, as a public authority, must have certainty in relation to its budgeting process. The commitment of the Regional District to include the funds necessary for the payment contemplated by the Grant Agreement needed to be

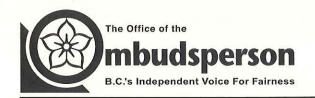

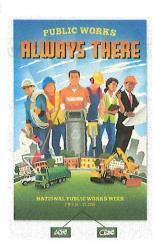

WHEREAS the current legislative tools available to local government in British Columbia regarding matters of questionable conduct and breaches of code of conduct of elected officials result in expensive quasi-judicial processes, eroding public confidence, strained internal relationships, and produce limited viable outcomes;

AND WHEREAS elected officials in local government do not have access to independent advice regarding conflict of interest or other matters related to Codes of Conduct, nor an effective process to objectively resolve contraventions, accusations or public complaints;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that UBCM lobby the Provincial Government to enact enabling legislation that would empower local governments with the ability to appoint local independent Integrity Commissioners who would serve the public and elected officials in an advisory, educational and investigative role in the application and enforcement of Codes of Conduct.

#### Background:

The *Community Charter* addresses ethical considerations for elected officials in Part 4, Division 6 and 7 with legislation related to conflict of interest. There is no legislation in British Columbia however that speaks to, or provides for the adoption of enforceable Codes of Conduct. Local Governments in British Columbia are increasingly aware of the impacts, both to public confidence in political processes and unnecessary legal costs, when the definitions of conflict, ethics and integrity for an elected local government official are not commonly shared, and/or are challenged.

Furthermore, the current legislated authority to enforce and/or impose restrictions or sanctions for elected officials distracts from good governance. The process relies on a local government to act in a quasi-judicial setting towards a member of their own board or council. When there are questions or challenges, the involved elected official is left without independent advice or is compelled to engage independent legal counsel of their own. These processes are divisive and costly, and distract from the priority business of the local government. When the process requires the involvement of a corporate lawyer to ensure procedural fairness, the costs and stakes escalate.

Within British Columbia the two recent court cases of *Barnett v CRD* and *Skakun v Prince George* have established the required procedure for local governments and also highlighted the need for a different and more effective process.

Local governments across Canada are developing Code of Conduct policies in order to help guide and inform elected officials, staff and the public with regards to expectations related to acceptable conduct while in office as well as clearly defining roles and responsibilities. The Provincial Governments in Alberta and Saskatchewan are amending current legislation related to the establishment of codes of conduct at the local government level. The City of Calgary, in early 2015, voted to create a part time Integrity Commissioner.

In Ontario, legislation provides a model for local governments with the option to adopt a Code of Conduct for members of Council and local boards through their own bylaws. This voluntary legislation also enables a Local Government to appoint an Integrity Commissioner to address the application of the Code and, if delegated, the procedural and policy decision-making authority related to the enforcement of Codes of Conduct. While investigation and regulation are part of the role, the Ontario experience in several municipalities demonstrates the positive role of an Integrity Commissioner in an advisory capacity to elected officials.

The proposed resolution to allow the option of appointing an Integrity Commissioner would serve to strengthen the foundation of good governance for local governments in BC. An Integrity Commissioner in an advisory role could further educate and inform elected officials and the public on acceptable conduct for political leaders as defined by a local government. Furthermore, an Integrity Commissioner could establish a process to conduct impartial investigations into informal or formal complaints from the public and/or elected officials that would serve as a supplement to existing statutes, documents and policies that govern the conduct of elected officials. It is further expected that the Integrity Commissioner could be empowered to recommend appropriate sanctions or dismiss unfounded claims all in a transparent public venue.

The Province is in a unique position to enact legislation to include the appointment of local independent Integrity Commissioners that would better meet the needs of local governments, their elected officials and the public in service to their community.

Subject: Gas Tax (Community Works Fund) Projects 2016

#### **Recommendation:**

THAT the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District Board of Directors approve the allocation of \$1.32 million in gas tax funds for 2016 to the following projects:

- 1. \$80,000 to the Cherry Creek Trail between Cherry Creek and the Community Hall.
- 2. \$40,000 for the Beaver Creek Community Hall playground.
- 3. \$100,000 for Sproat Lake Community Trails.
- 4. \$600,000 for the Bamfield Water Treatment Facility.
- 5. \$100,000 for Salmon Beach well development.
- 6. \$100,000 Millstream water system upgrades
- 7. \$150,000 Beaver Creek water system to upgrade the service to the Kackamin facility.
- 8. \$150,000 Bell Road water infrastructure.

#### **Background:**

The Electoral Area Directors Committee has met several times to review potential gas tax projects. There will be approximately \$1.32 million available as of December 2016. The following are the specific projects proposed by the Committee:

- 1. \$80,000 to the Cherry Creek Trail between Cherry Creek and the Community Hall an ACRD community park service.
- 2. \$40,000 for the Beaver Creek Community Hall playground to be constructed by the association.
- 3. \$100,000 for Sproat Lake Community Trails detailed plan to be developed by the Parks committee

and the allocation of the remainder of the available funding for ACRD owned water systems as follows:

- 1. \$600,000 for the Bamfield Water Treatment Facility to provide a two-thirds funding commitment (based on the 2014 cost estimates) and enables the project to proceed in a timely fashion as Bamfield Water system is under a long term water advisory.
- 2. \$100,000 for Salmon Beach to establish a community well that will provides the public treated water option within the community.
- 3. \$100,000 Millstream water system for capital upgrades.
- 4. \$150,000 Beaver Creek water system to upgrade the watermain serving the Kackamin facility.

5. \$150,000 Bell Road (additional to previous \$264,000 allocation) project still in planning stages, requires service area approval and not likely to proceed until 2017.

The total allocation as above is \$1.32 million

#### <u>Time Requirements – Staff & Elected Officials:</u>

Staff time to prepare the agreement that must be made with the Beaver Creek Community Hall, confirm works meet the ACRD policies and procedures as committed within the agreement. The internal Gas Tax projects will have demands on staff time as they are undertaken and working with committees, engineers and contractors.

#### **Financial:**

The renewal of the Gas Tax funding has provided another opportunity to allocate funds to the various needs within our region. The Electoral Areas receive funding annually and in the 2016 another \$450,000 will be received plus any interest stemming from balances held. The current Gas Tax agreement between UBCM and the federal government runs until March 31, 2024.

#### **Policy or Legislation:**

As per ACRD purchase policies, asset management standards and criteria for the gas tax expenditures as outlined in the agreement with the federal government.

#### **Options Considered:**

Monies are being allocated to projects with few other options for capital assistance.

**Subject:** Proposed Building Inspection Agreement with the District of Ucluelet

#### **Recommendation:**

That the Board of Directors enters into a one (1) year agreement with the District of Ucluelet to provide building inspection services and direct the CAO and Chairperson to sign the attached BUILDING INSPECTION RESOURCE SHARING AGREEMENT.

#### **Desired Outcome:**

The District of Ucluelet requires a building inspector to provide building inspection services for the District on an interim basis and has requested the ACRD building inspectors provide this service.

#### **Summary:**

District of Ucluelet's current building inspection agreement with the ACRD expires on April 27, 2016

Under the agreement, the District of Ucluelet establishes, charges, and collects all fees. The ACRD would bill the District of Ucluelet for the time spent on building permits and wood stove inspections.

#### **Background:**

The current agreement is for interim building inspection services and staff recommends renewing this agreement in order to provide building inspection support to the District of Ucluelet while a more permanent agreement is worked out.

The Districts of Ucluelet and Tofino have both requested the ACRD provide building inspection services on a permanent basis. ACRD staff is working on agreements with both municipalities. However, staff feels it is important to have the ACRD building inspector vacancy filled before entering into more permanent agreements with Ucluelet and Tofino. This one year agreement allows the ACRD to continue providing building inspection services after April 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Note**: The current building inspection agreements with Tofino and Port Alberni expire February 2017 and December 2019 respectively. The agreement with Toquaht First Nation has also expired and needs to be renewed.

#### <u>Time Requirements – Staff & Elected Officials:</u>

The ACRD building inspection service has the capacity to provide this service, with trips coordinated with other inspections when possible.

#### **Financial:**

The agreement proposes a cost recovery system based on the time spent on the District of Ucluelet building permits and travel. The hourly rate will be at 1.59 times the building inspector's hourly rate to cover benefits, supervision, and administration. Vehicle mileage will be \$0.55/km. Where ever possible, mileage and travel time will be shared with travel to the West Coast and Salmon Beach.

#### **Policy or Legislation:**

The proposed agreement is a renewal of the current agreement. The ACRD has the ability to enter into agreements with other governments. As the recommended term of this agreement is one year, the building inspection service arrangements can be reviewed and there is a clause that allows either party to provide notice and terminate the contract.

The proposed agreement includes an indemnity clause (section 2.1) and stipulates that the ACRD Building Inspectors will only provide plan checks and inspect construction for compliance with the BC Building Code. The District of Ucluelet is responsible for confirming compliance with the District of Ucluelet bylaws and all Federal and Provincial Acts and Regulations.

#### **Options Considered:**

The options are to enter into the contract and provide building inspection services or not to enter into the agreement.

This Agreement shall be known as the "BUILDING INSPECTION RESOURCE SHARING AGREEMENT"

#### WHEREAS

Ucluelet wishes to occasionally retain the services of the Region's building inspection staff to undertake building inspection work within Ucluelet's jurisdiction.

The Region is willing to make their building inspection staff available to Ucluelet under the terms and conditions outlined in this agreement.

**THEREFORE** in consideration of the mutual covenants and other considerations recited below, the parties agree as follows:

## 1. Definitions

"Ucluelet Supervisor" means the Manager of Planning

"Regional Building Inspector" means the incumbent in an employment position titled "Building Inspector" at the Region.

"Regional Supervisor" means the Manager of Planning and Development.

"Regional Collective Agreement" means the prevailing collective agreement in place between and the Region and the Canadian Union of Public Employees Local 118.

#### 2. Ucluelet Covenants

- 2.1 Ucluelet assumes all risk and agrees to indemnify and hold the Region harmless, and to defend the Region against and from any claims, costs, liabilities, expenses (including, without limitation, court costs and attorneys' fees), or demands of whatsoever nature arising from the actions of the Region's Building Inspector's providing inspections, approvals, reports, permits, and other activities in good faith at Ucluelet's request and within the jurisdiction of Ucluelet.
- 2.2 The Ucluelet Supervisor will be responsible for confirming that all construction complies with District of Ucluelet bylaws and all other applicable Federal and provincial Acts and Regulations.

## 3. Region Covenants

- 3.1 Provided that the Regional Supervisor determines that the Region's operational needs can be met, the Region will make the Regional Building Inspector available to Ucluelet when requested by the Ucluelet Supervisor.
- 3.2 The Regional Building Inspector will only conduct plan checks, inspect construction for compliance with the B.C. Building Code and provide woodstove inspections. The Ucluelet Supervisor will be responsible for confirming that all construction complies with District of Ucluelet bylaws and all other applicable Federal and Provincial Acts and Regulations.
- 3.3 The Region will continue to pay all wages and benefits for the Regional Building Inspector while working on Ucluelet inspections. The Region will subsequently invoice Ucluelet for all time the Regional Building Inspector spends on Ucluelet inspections based on the specified hourly rate in the Regional Collective Agreement times a factor of 1.59 to cover benefits, supervision, and administration.
- 3.4 The Region will provide a vehicle for the Regional Building Inspector's use for transportation to and from assigned Ucluelet inspections and will subsequently invoice Ucluelet for required mileage at a rate of \$0.55/km.

## 4. Term of Agreement:

4.1 The term of this agreement shall be from the 28 day of April, 2016 to the 27 day of April, 2017 and shall continue in force from month to month thereafter until a new agreement is reached or the agreement is terminated by either party upon 30 days written notice to the other party.

4.2 Notwithstanding Section 4.1 above, if a dispute arises between the parties concerning the interpretation or performance of the obligations provided for in this agreement which dispute cannot be resolved informally or by mediation, either party may terminate the agreement following thirty days written notice.

#### **Recommendation:**

The Public Service Accounting Board and senior levels of government view this process as a strong governance tool in the financial decision making process.

The ACRD has been awarded a \$10,000 grant from UBCM to complete this process by the end of 2016. The ACRD must have the Asset Management plan in place in order to better financial oversight for long lived assets and operation of these assets. The requirement of having the plan in place has been and will be a part of the many grant applications that we apply for and will assist our chances of having success.

The Asset Management plan has been identified as a key initiative in 2016.

#### Time Requirements – Staff & Elected Officials:

There will be a large amount of staff time required to bring the Asset Management plan in and outside consultants may be required to determine best practices.

#### **Financial:**

Staff will identify a best fit for tracking the ACRD assets and the purchase of software may be required. The use of the \$10,000 grants from UBCM will enable the ACRD reduce the costs of staff time and training that will be undertaken. The estimate for wages and training was approximately \$25,000 in 2016.

Subject: Build Canada Application – Alberni Valley Landfill (AVLF) - Solid Waste Diversion Project

#### **Recommendation:**

THAT the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District Board of Directors apply for funding through the New Building Canada Fund - Small Communities for the Alberni Valley Landfill Solid Waste Diversion Project.

#### **Summary:**

The Regional District applied for funding through the Building Canada Fund for the Bamfield Water treatment plant in 2015. This application was not successful. The option of using Electoral Area Gas Tax funds for the Bamfield Water treatment plant is now the preferred option to proceed with the project. This leaves the Regional District with the opportunity to apply for another project through the Build Canada grant. The Alberni Valley Landfill has capital projects in the current Financial Plan which meet the criteria to apply to the Build Canada program.

Staff has met with the Landfill engineer to review the options for diversion of materials that will enable the AVLF to reduce the Green House Gas (GHG) emissions and meet the future requirements of the landfill operating permit. The current layout has limited area to expand and the plan is to improve the site with the use of the property to the north of the Landfill that was acquired last year. As the engineer completes the plan staff will provide the Committee and the Board for their review.

The Alberni Valley & Bamfield Services Committee met on April 6, 2016 and passed a resolution recommending that the Board of Directors support the application for the AVLF - Solid Waste Diversion Project to the Build Canada Fund.

## <u>Time Requirements – Staff & Elected Officials:</u>

There will be some increase in demands on staff in the next month to complete the application by the deadline of April 26, 2016. Also oversight of the works if successful, portions of the work were committed to in the 2016-2020 Financial Plan for the AVLF capital project and the Solid Waste Management diversion initiatives.

#### Financial:

2016-2020 Financial Plan includes capital works of this nature and staff have identified approximately \$500,000 that could be used within the current budget for this project application. A successful grant

application would provide the possibility of a 1.5 million project to be undertaken at the AVLF transfer station. The capital reserve for the AVLF has the capability of undertaking on these addition works if there is a need to amend the budget later in 2016.

### **Policy or Legislation:**

The 2016-2020 Financial Plan may need to be amended to access funds in order to provide the one third funding support for this project. A motion to amend the Financial Plan would be provided if required once the project details are confirmed in advance of the application to the Build Canada grant program.

Any use of the ACRD's property will meet regulatory requirements which will be assessed by the ACRD's consulting engineer.

Berry and Vale Contacting Ltd. has provided excellent guidance and are a tremendous resource to finding solutions to problems as operational challenges occur.

The West Coast Landfill Operations Contract with Berry & Vale Contracting expires on June 30, 2016. The contract has a renewal option for an additional five year term.

The West Committee met on February 18, 2016 West Coast Committee the concurred with the staff recommended to the Board of Directors to Regional District staff recommends the operating contract be extended for an additional five year term.

### <u>Time Requirements – Staff & Elected Officials:</u>

#### Financial:

The funds for the operation of the West Coast Landfill come from the West Coast Landfill Waste Management budget. Article 21 – Quantities and Prices of the Operations Contract will need to have a letter of understanding attached with the renewal of the contract 2016 – 2021. Staff recommends that the increases for the contract year over year are as per CPI Victoria increases (decreases will be considered nil). The increase in the contract for 2016 would be 1.1% as the CPI increase in Victoria for 2015. The current annual contract value is \$414,166.33 and with the increase effective July 1, 2016 would be \$418,722.20.

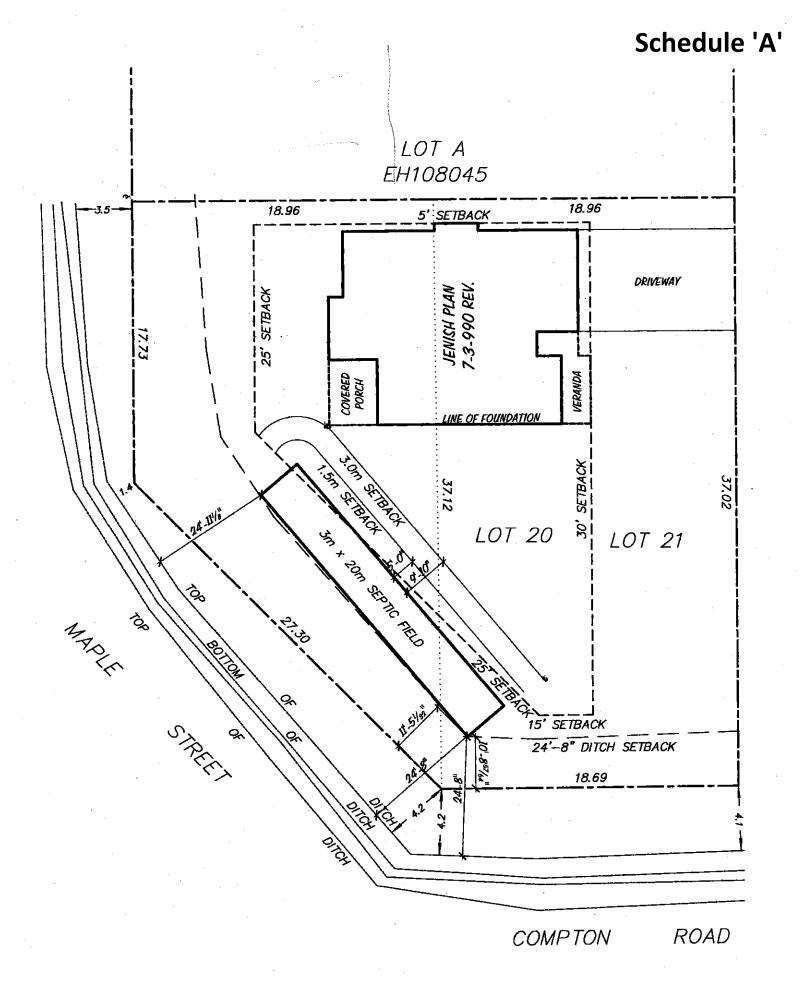

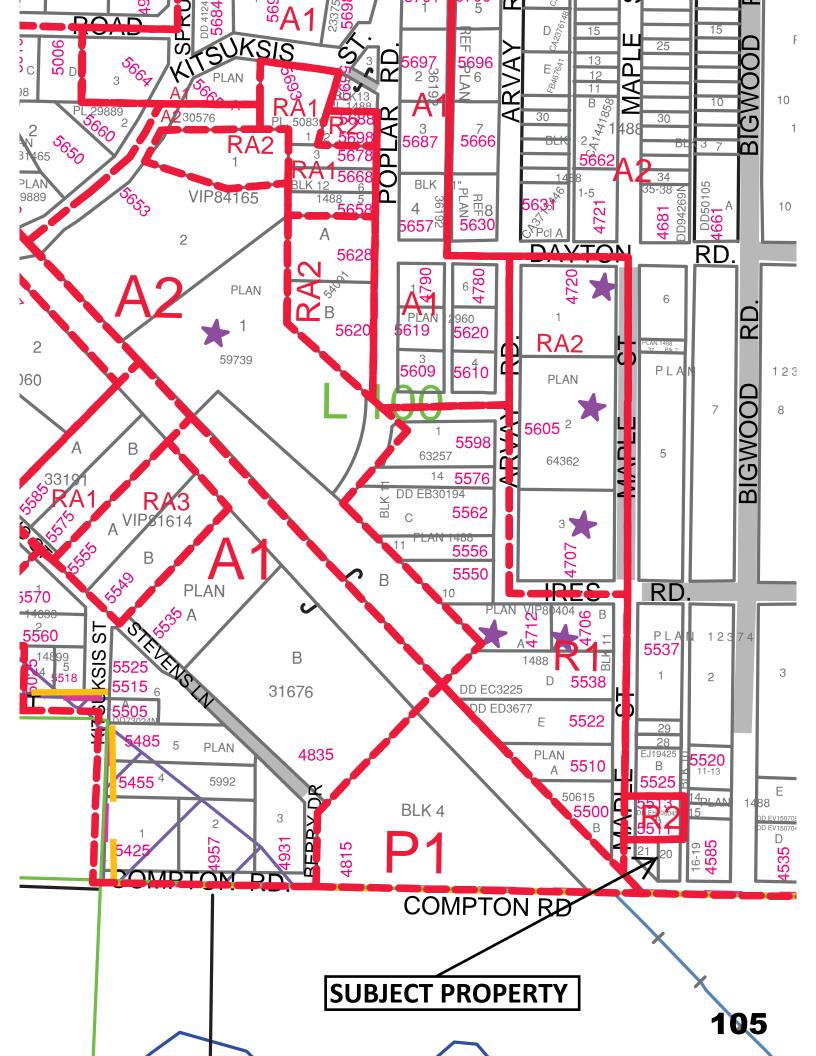

A Public Hearing for Bylaws P1336, P1337 and P1338 was held on Tuesday, March 29, 2016 in the Board Room at the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District office. The meeting was chaired by Electoral Area "D" (Sproat Lake) Director Penny Cote and attended by ACRD planning staff Mike Irg and Charity Hallberg Dodds, property owners Kelvin and Gail Sheeler and 5 members of the public.

There were no written submissions received prior to the public hearing. The agency referral comments were referenced, copies were made available and are attached to the public hearing minutes as Appendix 'A'.

A presentation was made by the applicant Kelvin Sheeler outlining his application to develop a RV and boat storage facility with one caretaker residence.

Three members of the public expressed concerns about run off, contaminate control and highway access. The applicant explained how the property would be developed and the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure has already issued an access permit for the proposed development. The subject property is within DPA III – Form and Character and issuance of a development permit will be required prior to construction.

Minutes of a Public Hearing held on Tuesday, March 29, 2016 at 7:00 pm in the Board Room at the Regional District of Alberni-Clayoquot Office, 3008 Fifth Avenue, Port Alberni BC.

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm.

2. Director Cote introduces herself and planning staff and asks staff to read out Notice of Public Hearing.

3. The notice is read by M. Irg as follows:

A Public Hearing for residents and property owners within Electoral Area "D" will be held in the Board Room at the Regional District of Alberni-Clayoquot office, 3008 Fifth Avenue, Port Alberni BC, at 7:00 pm on Tuesday, March 29, 2016 to consider the following bylaws:

**Bylaw P1336** to amend the Sproat Lake Official Community Plan by redesignating a portion of LOT A, DISTRICT LOT 140, ALBERNI DISTRICT, PLAN VIP83219 from "Rural Use" to "Commercial Use" on Schedule A, Map No. 2 Land use Designations; and by including a portion of LOT A, DISTRICT LOT 140, ALBERNI DISTRICT, PLAN VIP83219 within "DPA-III Form and Character" on Schedule A, Map No. 3 Development Permit Areas and Development Approval Information Area to facilitate development of a mixed storage facility.

**Bylaw P1337** to amend the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District Zoning Bylaw No. 15 by adding section "135B Mixed Storage (SW-2A) District".

**Bylaw P1338** to amend the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District Zoning Bylaw No. 15 by rezoning LOT A, DISTRICT LOT 140, ALBERNI DISTRICT, PLAN VIP83219 from Small Holdings (A1) District to Mixed Storage (SW-2A) District to facilitate development of a mixed storage facility.

#### (Kelvin and Gail Sheeler, Property Owners – Lot A, VIP83219 Pacific Rim Highway)

All persons who consider their interest in property affected by the proposed bylaws will be given an opportunity to be heard in matters contained in the bylaws.

The Public Hearing for Bylaws P1336, P1337 and P1338 is to be held by the Director for Electoral Area 'D', the Alternate Director, or the Chairperson of the Regional Board, as a delegate of the Regional Board. A copy of the Board resolution making this delegation is available for public inspection along with copies of the bylaws as set out in this notice.

Interested persons may inspect the bylaws and relevant background documents at the Regional District of Alberni-Clayoquot office during normal office hours, 8:00 am to 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday,



excluding statutory holidays, from March 18, 2016 to March 29, 2016, inclusive. Any correspondence submitted prior to the Public Hearing should be directed to the undersigned.

Mike Irg, Manager of Planning and Development

- 4. Director Cote explains the purpose of the public hearing and asks staff to read out any correspondence received ahead of the public hearing.
- 5. M. Irg states that no letters were received from members of the public and that four agency referral comments (Appendix 'A') were received with printed copies available.
- 6. Director Cote asks the applicants to explain their proposal.
- 7. Kelvin Sheeler describes the proposal. Their intention is to develop a mixed storage facility including 30 to 40 covered storage areas for boats and RV's, 20 to 25 closed storage units, a caretaker's residence, and limited open storage. Following the land clearing, they intend to have the site reviewed by a geotechnical engineer to help them determine the layout of the development and the appropriate capacity. The facility will be completely fenced with chain link fencing and will have secured gated entry and exit ways.
- 8. Director Cote thanks the applicants for their presentation and invites the members of the public to add comments and ask questions. She requests that they wait until they have been recognized by her and begin with their name and address.
- 9. Andy Johnston of 7672 Pacific Rim Highway speaks first. He is a resident and property owner of the property directly across the highway from the subject property. He has concerns about the proximity of his well, contamination possibilities, run off control, what safe guards will be implemented, access from the highway, noise and whether or not the site will have a pavement or gravel surface.
- 10. Ray Caron of 7684 Pacific Rim Highway is next to speak. He is also a resident and neighbour and his property is next door to Andy Johnston and across the highway from the subject property. He has the same concerns that were voiced by Andy and is concerned about possible contamination to his well due to runoff. He asks what measures will be put in place to contain and/or mitigate and contamination.
- 11. Bill Thomson of 8081 McCoy Lake Road is next to speak. He is the owner of the farmland across the highway from the subject property. His concerns include run off from the development, sewage contamination to his farmland from the proposed development as well as the Tseshaht First Nation systems, inappropriate development of the land below the powerlines, access challenges from the highway and his opinion that the site is not a suitable location for the proposed development. He recommends that the applicants discuss their proposal with the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MoTI) prior to moving forward as he has had access challenges in the past while developing his farm market across the highway. He feels that this type of development would be better suited for an industrial park.
- 12. Gail Sheeler states that they have already had discussions with MoTI regarding access and have a finalized and approved design and access permit from them.



- 13. Bill Thomson continues to express his concern about the runoff contamination of farmland, the impact to farmland that is created, the proposal is not a proper fit and questions the government's actions regarding the processing of this application, another application being held back, what's going on everywhere and whether or not things are fair. He suggests that the Regional Board take a good look at things. He then discusses his recent challenge with BC Assessment's application of a commercial status to his farm market property and wonders if this rezoning application is why that happened to him.
- 14. Mike Irg explains that the BC Assessment's land use classification system and/or decisions are not related to the Regional District. This application would not have an effect on BC Assessment's decision to reclassify Bill's property. He also clarifies that the other rezoning application that Bill may be talking about, was withdrawn by the applicant.
- 15. Bill Thomson again expresses his concerns about the runoff. He describes the history of the land in the area and how, many years ago, all the water in the area was channeled to run to his property. He believes that all of the sewage from the Tseshaht First Nation homes, Stuart Road homes and highway properties ends up on his land. He doesn't mean to be a bearer of bad news but, you need to take care of your own property because no one else will.
- 16. Director Cote asks if any other members of the public would like to speak.
- 17. Ross Stevens of 5601 Sarenga Road says that he and his wife do not have anything to add at this time. That they will make an appointment to see Mike at a later date to discuss their property and plans.
- 18. Director Cote asks again if anyone has anything to add.
- 19. Bill Thomson states that nothing ever gets done and no one ever listens. That time and money are spent and nothing happens.
- 20. Andy Johnston asks for clarity on the meaning of commercial. What if the applicants change their minds at a later date?
- 21. Mike Irg clarifies aspects of the rezoning application process and the commercial OCP designation. He also explains how the ROW portion was excluded from the commercial designation due to a mapping error. Mike provides additional information on the proposed text amendment and the related minimum parcel size increase.
- 22. Andy Johnston discusses the adjacent Barking Spot business that was in operation many years ago and how that business negatively affected him. He felt that it was a nightmare and was not a good business for that property and location.
- 23. Mike Irg explains that mixed storage including a caretaker residence will be the only permitted use on the subject property.



- 24. Ross Stevens asks what would happen if the applicant changed their minds and wanted to do something else 5 years down the road.
- 25. Mike Irg explains that they would have to apply to rezone and go through the whole process again. He then reads out the proposed text amendment and summarizes all the details.
- 26. Ross Stevens asks if those guidelines are from the OCP.
- 27. Mike Irg answers that the details are from the zone.
- 28. Ross Stevens asks where the zones come from.
- 29. Mike Irg explains that the zoning bylaw contains numerous zones that permit various uses on different properties. He mentions that there are a number of commercial, industrial and residential zones and that in some cases, zones are created to suit a proposal or to accommodate changes in other regulations.
- 30. Director Cote clarifies that this zone is very specific and only permits the operation of a mixed storage facility.
- 31. Ross Stevens asks if commercial allow anything and why does he have to wait for the OCP.
- 32. Mike Irg explains that the use has to comply with the zone and the OCP.
- 33. Ross Stevens asks if he can apply.
- 34. Mike Irg explains that this public hearing is related only to the subject property and the proposed development. That the Stevens' are welcome to make an appointment with him to discuss the development of their own property at another time.
- 35. Bill Thomson says that commercial allows a lot of options.
- 36. Mike Irg clarifies the purpose of OCP designation versus zoning.
- 37. Ross Stevens feels that his business and this business are the same thing.
- 38. Director Cote directs the public to the subject property and proposed development being the topic of this public hearing.
- 39. Andy Johnston asks what will stop the applicants from storing 40 leaky logging trucks on the property.
- 40. Gail Sheeler states that they will not let that happen. It is not their intention to create a messy eyesore on the property.



- 41. Director Cote suggests that the applicant be given the floor to make some comments and answer some questions.
- 42. Kelvin Sheeler states that his understanding of the zone is that the storage of boats and RV's are permitted but not the storage of commercial vehicles. He expects that if there is storage of non-permitted vehicles, the District would have an enforcement process in place to ensure they are following the rules of the zone. They intend to run a legitimate storage business as a retirement project. They wanted something low profile and professional. They will be installing an engineered septic system and will not be taking shortcuts. There will be no washing of commercial units, boats or RV's on site nor will there be any repairs or mechanical works being done. If that type of work is required, the owner will have to take the unit away to have it completed. Kelvin confirms that access from the highway has already been addressed and that they will need to comply with the approved design plan. The plan has been developed with the 60 km/hr speed zone in mind and includes a 27 metre pull-in and adequate room to pull off the highway with an RV or boat before reaching the security gate. They feel that the business will not create any additional noise compared to the existing highway noise. They have already looked into what is permitted on the land below the hydro ROW. They can use that area for their septic field and/or caretaker residence access driveway. That area will not be utilized as an entry or exit way for the storage business. The storage units will be 3-sided buildings with perimeter drains to control runoff. They do not foresee septic issues with the engineered system and they are required to comply with health regulations, including setbacks from water supplies and wells, just like anyone else.
- 43. Mike Irg again mentions the referral agency comments and specifically reads out the comments received from the ACRD building inspector regarding contamination controls and regulations. He also explains that this development will require a development permit for form and character. Mike clarifies to everyone present that this application was made prior to development and construction of the property and prior to any use taking place on the property.
- 44. Director Cote asks if the surface of the development will be paved or graveled.
- 45. Kelvin Sheeler answers that the surfaces will be graveled.
- 46. Director Cote asks if the business will be seasonal in nature. It would be assumed that the units being stored would be removed during spring and summer months.
- 47. Kelvin Sheeler agrees.
- 48. Gail Sheeler adds that it is likely that many of the RV's would possibly be gone in the winter as well belonging to those who travel south for the winter months.
- 49. Bill Thomson asks about the catch basins and where does the material go.
- 50. Mike explains the requirements for oil separators and interceptors that would be in place to deal with unexpected spills.



- 51. Andy Johnston says they don't work on graveled surfaces.
- 52. Bill Thomson says that he appreciates the \$30,000 septic system although they don't work during heavy periods of rain. They only work during the dry weather. Even the expensive system that the Tseshaht First Nation installed next do him doesn't work and everything drains into his land.
- 53. Director Cote states that there are problems with septic systems everywhere. Many systems are older and/or not maintained correctly. Everyone is regulated by the Island Health Authority and is not controlled by the Regional District.
- 54. Bill Thomson asks what do you have control of. He had the head guy from the Health Authority out and he just walked away.
- 55. Director Cote acknowledges that Bill is frustrated but asks to keep the conversation related to the subject application. She then asks if anyone else would like to speak.
- 56. Bill Thomson states that the applicants need to be aware.
- 57. Andy Johnston says it is too bad that they can't tap into the Tseshaht First Nation sewage system.
- 58. Bill Thomson makes a comment on the Tseshaht First Nation's system.
- 59. Director Cote says she does not know about what options there are or will be related to hooking into the Tseshaht First Nation's septic system or water supply at this time. She asks if anyone had anything else to add.
- 60. Andy Johnston asks how many vehicles may be stored at the facility.
- 61. Mike Irg explains that they are permitted 60% lot coverage by the zone.
- 62. Kelvin Sheeler explains that it will be determined by the engineer as to how many actual units will be developed although they are hoping for up to 40 closed and maybe 6 open units.
- 63. Andy Johnston asks about old, leaky RV's being stored on site. What happens if something is leaking when no one is around? Who will notice.
- 64. Director Cote says that it will be up to the applicants to monitor the units being stored on site.
- 65. Mike Irg explains the differences between commercial zoning and storage zoning.
- 66. Andy Johnston states that there could be 40 leaky vehicles on the property.
- 67. Kelvin Sheeler enforces their intention to run a responsible and legitimate storage business. They do not intend to run a junk yard.



- 68. Mike Irg confirms the specific zone for storage only. No industrial uses are permitted. The condition of the units is also the responsibility of the owners.
- 69. Andy Johnston says that once the soil is contaminated, it's contaminated.
- 70. Director Cote says that she assumes there would be business rules and regulations put in place by the applicants. That derelict vehicles that have contamination concerns would not be accepted for storage. And that accidents happen that cannot be foreseen. She feels that it is not the Sheeler's intent to bring junk onsite.
- 71. Mike Irg reiterates that the site will be designed and built to required regulations.
- 72. Bill Thompson says that boats and RV's are the same as old logging trucks. Stuff can happen when no one is there and there will be a large concentrated group of them onsite.
- 73. Andy Johnston adds that they will be leaking onto the gravel.
- 74. Ross Stevens asks if anyone could come onsite once in awhile to see if things were running okay.
- 75. Kelvin Sheeler says yes. It will be a public business and you would be permitted to come onsite.
- 76. Director Cote asks if there are any further questions for this application. No one has anything else to add. She proceeds to advise everyone present that the Board cannot receive any new information between the end of the hearing and the April 13<sup>th</sup> board meeting where they make a decision on the bylaws. She then calls three times for further representations. Hearing none, the public hearing is terminated at 7:53 pm.

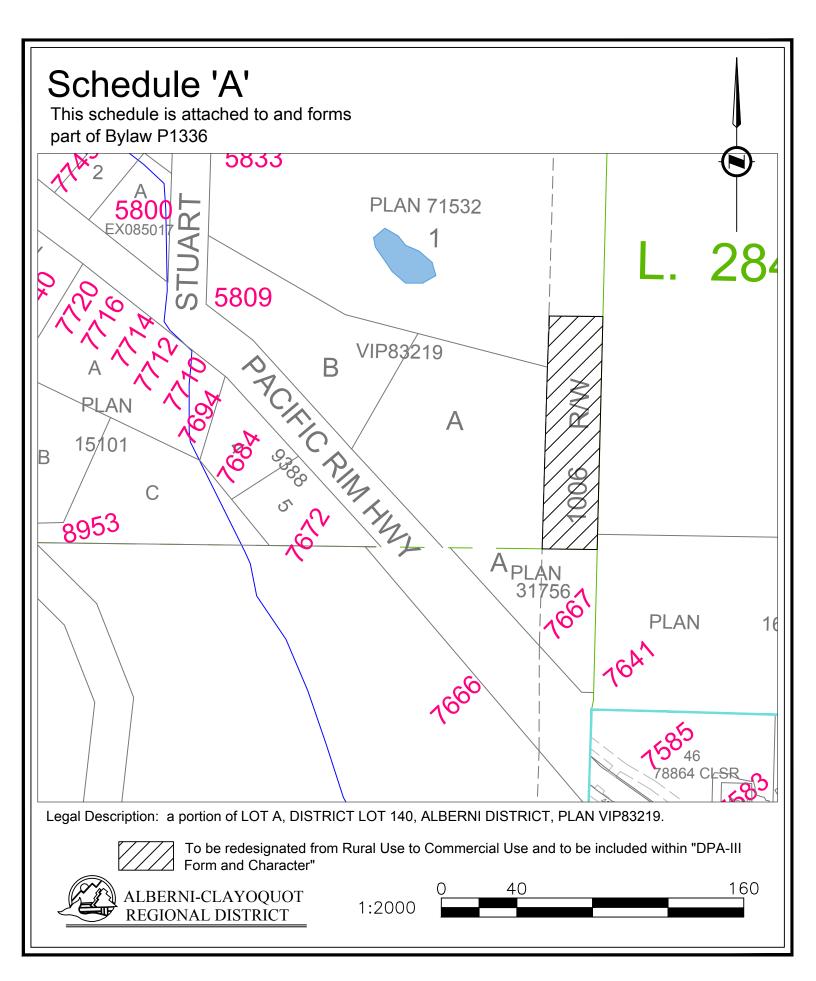

WHEREAS the *Local Government Act* authorizes the Regional Board to amend a zoning bylaw after a public hearing and upon the affirmative vote of the directors in accordance with Sections 464, 465, 470 and 479 of the *Local Government Act*;

AND WHEREAS the Board of Directors of the Regional District of Alberni-Clayoquot, in open meeting assembled, enacts the following amendment to the text of the Regional District of Alberni-Clayoquot Zoning By-law No. 15, 1971:

#### 1. TITLE

This bylaw may be cited as the Regional District of Alberni-Clayoquot Zoning Text Amendment Bylaw No. P1337.

- 2. Bylaw No. 15 of the Regional District of Alberni-Clayoquot is hereby amended by:
  - a. Adding section "135B Mixed Storage (SW-2A) District" and subsections to read as follows:

135B Mixed Storage (SW-2A) District

This district provides for warehousing and for both open and closed storage for non-industrial purposes.

#### 135B.1 Uses Permitted

- (1) Warehousing and closed storage.
- (2) Open storage for boats, trucks, trailers, campers and similar items, but excluding works yards and the storage of industrial products and industrial materials such as those permitted under the Industrial Open Storage (M-4) District.
- (3) One dwelling for a caretaker or watchman.
- (4) Accessory buildings and uses including an office facility ancillary to the main use and parking and loading facilities.

#### 135B.2 Conditions of Use

(1) Where any lot or part thereof is used or intended to be used as open storage area, that portion of such storage area which fronts upon or adjoins a public

street, a lot in an R, RM, A1 or A2 district or is separated by a lane therefrom, shall be screened to a minimum height of 2 metres (6.56 feet) and no items stored within 15.24 metres (50 feet) of the screen shall extend above such screening.

#### 135B.3 Density

- (1) The minimum lot size shall be 1 hectare (2.47 acres) where the lot is serviced by an on-site well and septic system. The minimum lot size shall be reduced to 0.24 hectare (0.6 acre) where the lot is serviced by a community or communal water or sewer system.
- b. By amending Section 200, Schedule II Bulk and Site Regulations, to include the following line item:

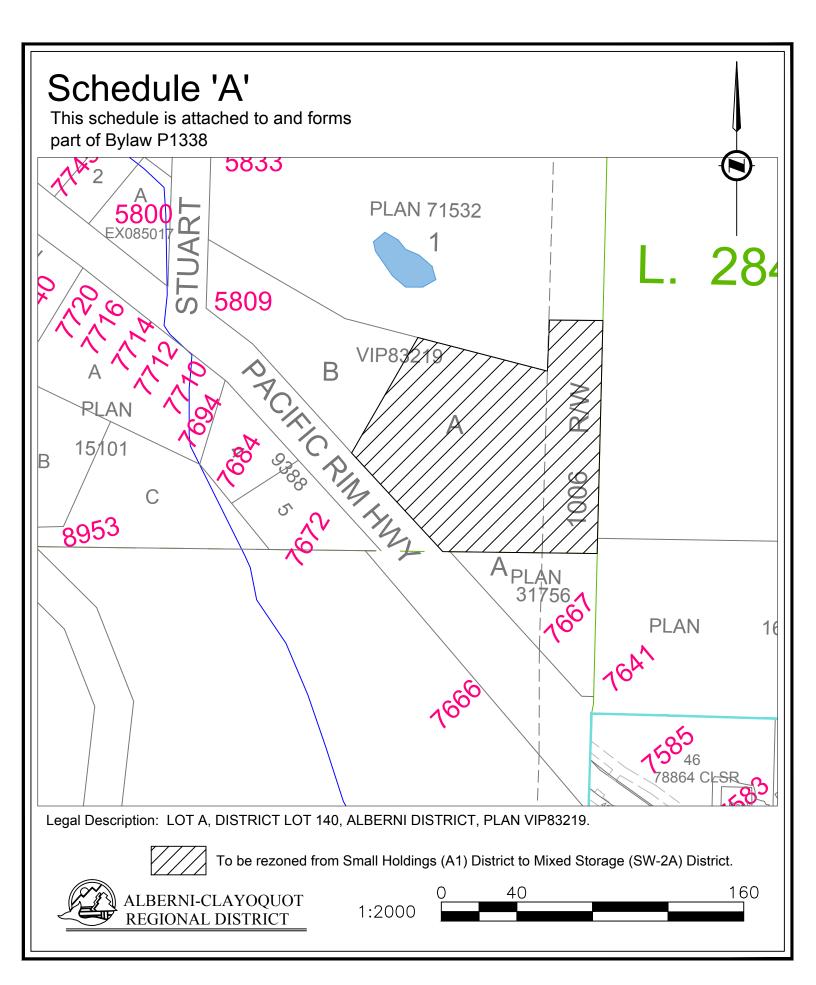

The meeting was chaired by Electoral Area "E" (Beaver Creek) Director John McNabb and attended by ACRD planning staff Mike Irg and Charity Hallberg Dodds, property owner Craig Bowerman and 3 members of the public.

There were no written submissions received prior to the public hearing. The agency referral comments were referenced; copies were made available and are attached to the public hearing minutes as Appendix 'A' and 'B'.

A presentation was made by the applicant Craig Bowerman outlining his application to develop 6546 Smith Road and create a two lot subdivision.

A presentation was made by the applicant Craig Bowerman outlining his application to develop 6476 Beaver Creek Road and create a two lot subdivision.

There were no questions from the public regarding P1334 and P1335, 6546 Smith Road. Questions for P1339, 6476 Beaver Creek Road included road right-of-ways, access and sewage disposal. Staff explained that access from Beaver Creek Road will be in the form of a common/shared driveway as confirmed in a letter on file from the applicant, which was read aloud (Appendix 'C').

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm.
- 2. Director McNabb introduces himself and planning staff. He recognizes the Tseshaht and Hupacasth First Nations' traditional territories. He then asks staff to read out Notice of Public Hearing.
- 3. The notice is read by M. Irg as follows:

A Public Hearing for residents and property owners within Electoral Area "E" will be held in the Board Room at the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District office, 3008 Fifth Avenue, Port Alberni, BC, at 7:00 pm on Tuesday, April 5, 2016 to consider the following bylaws:

**Bylaw P1334** to amend the Beaver Creek Official Community Plan by redesignating LOT A, DISTRICT LOT 162, ALBERNI DISTRICT, PLAN 19496, EXCEPT PART IN PLAN VIP68127 from "Rural Use" to "Residential Use" to facilitate a two-lot subdivision.

#### (Craig Bowerman, Property Owner – 6546 Smith Road)

**Bylaw P1335** to amend the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District Zoning Bylaw by rezoning LOT A, DISTRICT LOT 162, ALBERNI DISTRICT, PLAN 19496, EXCEPT PART IN PLAN VIP68127 from Small Holdings (A1) District to Acreage Residential (RA2)District to facilitate a two-lot subdivision.

#### (Craig Bowerman, Property Owner – 6546 Smith Road)

All persons who consider their interest in property affected by the proposed bylaws will be given an opportunity to be heard in matters contained in the bylaws.

The Public Hearing for Bylaws P1334, P1335, and P1339 is to be held by the Director for Electoral Area 'E', the Alternate Director, or the Chairperson of the Regional Board, as a delegate of the Regional Board. A copy of the Board resolution making this delegation is available for public inspection along with copies of the bylaws as set out in this notice.



Interested persons may inspect the bylaws and relevant background documents at the Regional District of Alberni-Clayoquot Office during normal office hours, 8:00 am to 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday, excluding statutory holidays, from March 23, 2016 to April 5, 2016 both inclusive. Any correspondence submitted prior to the Public Hearing should be directed to the undersigned.

Mike Irg, M.C.I.P, Manager of Planning and Development

- 4. Director McNabb explains the purpose of the public hearing and that there are two separate applications being considered at this hearing. He introduces application RE15007, Bylaws P1334 and P1335 for property located at 6546 Smith Road. He then asks the applicant to explain the proposal.
- 5. Craig Bowerman explains his intention to subdivide the subject property into two similar-sized lots. He has fixed up the existing home on Smith Road and anticipates construction of a new, single family dwelling on the new lot fronting Lothian Road.
- 6. Director McNabb asks staff to read out any written correspondence received prior to the public hearing.
- 7. Mike Irg explains that while no correspondence from the public was received, referral responses (Appendix 'A') were received and copies are available.
- 8. Director McNabb asks if any members of the public have any questions. He also asks if anyone would like to speak, to please introduce themselves and state their address.
- 9. Moe Zdebiak asks the size of the subject property.
- 10. Craig Bowerman answers two acres.
- 11. Director McNabb asks if there are any other questions. There are no more questions.
- 12. Mike Irg clarifies the purpose of the public hearing and its relation to the rezoning application process. He explains that the public hearing is to discuss these two properties and the two related applications only.
- 13. Director McNabb introduces the second application; RE15009, Bylaw P1339 for property located at 6476 Beaver Creek Road. He asks the applicant to explain the proposal.
- 14. Craig Bowerman explains his intention to subdivide into two lots. He has almost completed renovations and repairs to the existing house which will be located on a proposed 0.6 acre lot. The larger ~1.4 acre lot in the back will be accessed by a pan-handle type of shared/common access.
- 15. Director McNabb asks staff to read out any correspondence received.
- 16. Mike Irg explains that while no correspondence from the public was received, referral responses (Appendix 'B') were received and copies are available. He also mentions that a letter from the applicant regarding the



common access has been received and he reads it out loud (Appendix 'C').

- 17. Director McNabb asks the public if they have any questions.
- 18. Moe Zdebiak has questions about possible road dedication and the existing Shaw Road right-of-way. He has a copy of a proposed transportation plan indicating roadway extension from Shaw Road right through to Traves Road. He mentions that he has been in contact with the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure regarding the purchase of Shaw Road. He wonders why the roadway isn't going through.
- 19. Mike Irg explains the current right-of-way dedication requirement associated with subdivisions. He explains that Moe's map is from the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure and isn't a legal plan but a proposed roadway plan. There is no existing right-of-way through the properties as indicated on the map.
- 20. Director McNabb asks if a referral response was received from the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure.
- 21. Mike Irg said yes and reads the comments.
- 22. Phyllis Rossignol has concerns about the effect on property taxes, future zoning changes to her property, possible increase in vicious dogs in the neighbourhood, type and size of proposed home, septic system, parking and driveway, and is there enough room for everything.
- 23. Mike Irg explains that property values are assessed by BC Assessment. He explains that this hearing is only related to the subject property and that there will be no zoning changes to any other property. Mike also mentions that the ACRD has a vicious dog bylaw for the Beaver Creek area.
- 24. Phyllis Rossignol says that the bylaw is not enforced and that she has lost many pets and money to vicious dogs. She has spent a lot of money on vet bills associated with an incident where her goat was attacked by a dog.
- 25. Mike Irg asks her to contact him at the office to discuss that matter and that this public hearing is only about the rezoning application on the subject property. He mentions that Bowerman provided a letter regarding the proposed septic disposal system that will be installed.
- 26. Phyllis Rossignol asks if she would have to have a shared access on her property if she were to subdivide.
- 27. Mike Irg explains that she can talk to him about development of her property at a later time. That this public hearing is only about the subject property.
- 28. Director McNabb explains the subdivision process and states that it is the same for all applicants. He says the property taxes could be reduced due to development in the area.
- 29. Phyllis Rossignol says that in the past there was a petition put forward to dedicate a road right-of –way behind her property. She speaks on behalf of Hans Sorensen that they are both concerned that a petition



could force Hans to give up property for a right-of-way resulting from this development.

- 30. Mike Irg explains that road dedication requirements have changed over the years and he is not familiar with the petition process. He expects that the one she speaks of may be prior to the existence of the Regional District. He clarifies that there can be no right-of-way on Mr. Sorensen's property without his permission.
- 31. Director McNabb also feels the petition process could have been in place prior to the District's existence.
- 32. Phyllis Rossignol asks what type of house will be built and who will live there.
- 33. Craig Bowerman says that he does not know at this time.
- 34. Mike Irg explains that the zoning will regulate the size of house and that it is not possible to determine who will be living there.
- 35. Director McNabb asks the public if there are any more questions. None are raised. He then clearly states the importance of the Board of Directors not receiving any more information on the applications prior to making a decision on the bylaws. That if that happens, we would have to hold another public hearing. So if anyone has any more questions, now would be the time to ask them or talk to staff at a later date.
- 36. Director McNabb then calls three times for further representations on the bylaws. Hearing none, the meeting is terminated at 7:21 pm.

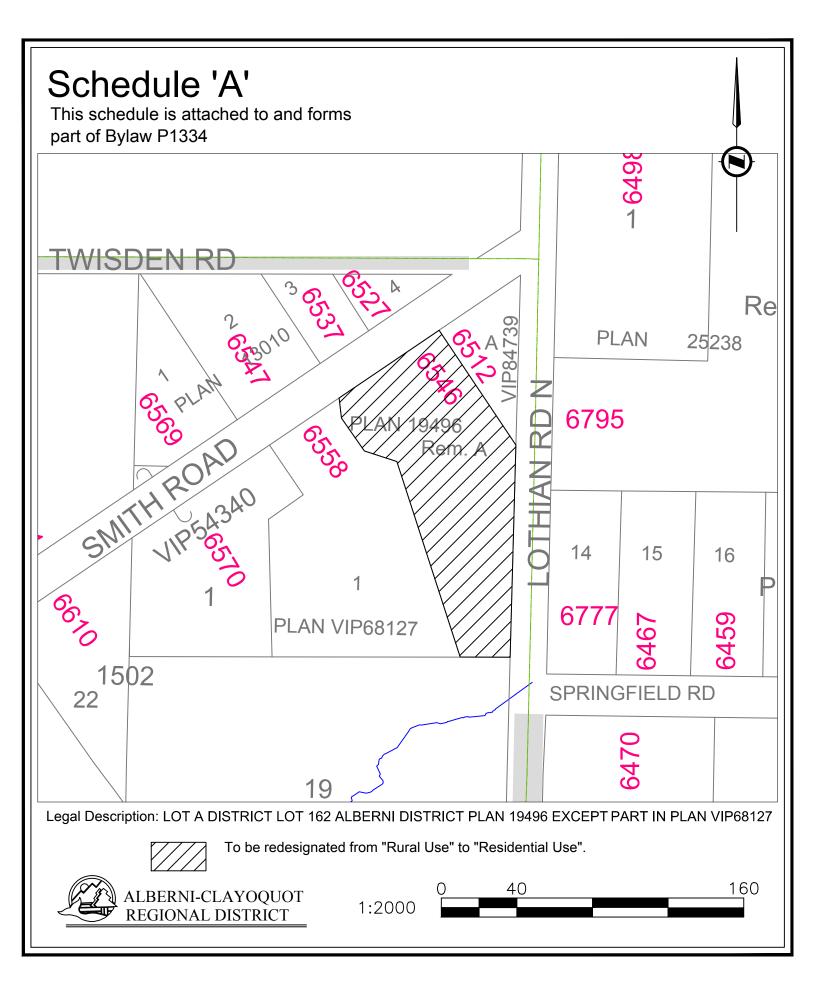

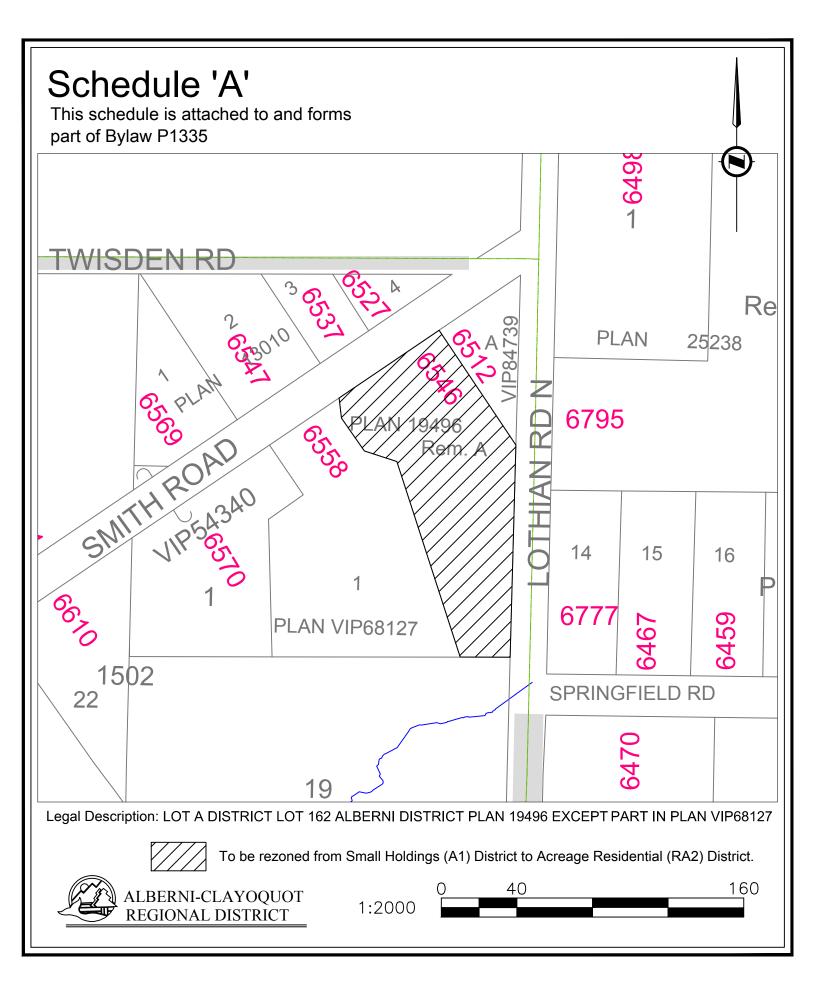

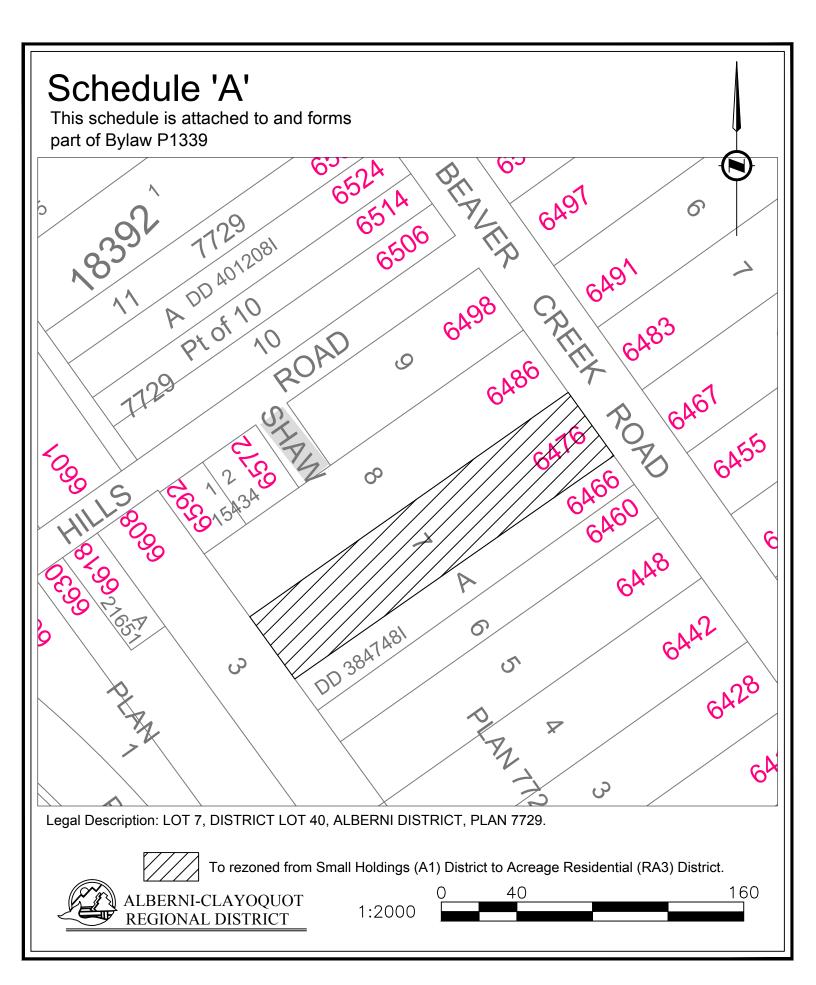

Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District/ Tla-o-qui-aht First Nations

**Port Alberni, BC.** -- The Alberni Clayoquot Regional District (ACRD) is pleased to announce that it has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Tla-o-qui-aht First Nations (TFN) that will see the completion of a detailed business plan, preliminary design and construction cost estimate for a recreation facility on the West Coast. The plan and design will be used by the West Coast Multiplex Society to fundraise capital costs for the facility's construction. While the availability of operational funding is in place, through the West Coast Multiplex Service Area bylaw adopted by the ACRD Board of Directors in 2012, the business plan will determine the project's viability. The location of the facility, near the Long Beach Airport, has been confirmed.

As part of the MOU, the ACRD and Tla-o-qui-aht First Nations will pursue a collaborative relationship to discuss economic, cultural and other benefits that the Multiplex might provide the region's residents, and how Tla-o-qui-aht First Nations could work with the ACRD to develop and deliver programs at the facility.

"This is the first MOU of this nature that the ACRD has signed with a First Nation, and it's a very important step forward in building a mutually beneficial relationship with Tla-o-qui-aht First Nations," said ACRD Chairperson and Tofino Mayor Josie Osborne.

"Tla-o-qui-aht has a strong vision of participating in economic opportunities within their traditional territories," said TFN Deputy Chief Councillor Elmer Frank, "TFN is strongly committed to improving access to recreational facilities for both their members and the ACRD area."

Funding in the amount of \$100,000 has been secured to support this MOU from Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada, via the Tla-o-qui-aht First Nations. This complements the \$106,916 that the ACRD has contributed to the project's development since 2008. The ACRD will administer the MOU funding and, with assistance from TFN and the West Coast Multiplex Society, oversee the development of the business plan and preliminary design.

"The business plan and design are critical pieces of information," said Ucluelet Mayor Dianne St. Jacques. "They provide the detailed information needed to fundraise for the building, and to understand the operational costs and overall viability of the facility."

"We are very excited about the MOU," said West Coast Multiplex Society Chair Samantha Hackett, "It is a big breakthrough for the Society and helps us immensely in our planning and fundraising."
