




2015 Weather

transitioned into


above average hot & dry summer

- 4. Resource values







Current pressures on our program

- Worksafe BC requirements & **BCWS Safe Work Standards**
 - Unable to use "Street Hire" or conscripted fire fighters
 - Hours of Work/Fatigue
 - Danger trees/unstable slopes
- Environmental impacts
 - Pressure to lessen slash/ industry burning due to smoke concerns
 - Post wildfire natural hazards




