## District of Kitimat Releases Open Letter Appealing Canada to Add Value to Natural Resources

**KITIMAT, BC** – The District of Kitimat (Kitimat) has released an open letter to Canada stating "We Canadians must seize opportunities to add value to our natural resources before exporting to foreign markets." The open letter will have full page publication in the Saturday, December 10<sup>th</sup> editions of The Province, Vancouver Sun, Edmonton Journal, and Ottawa Citizen, and for two weeks following will remain on those publications' online sites.

Kitimat believes that value-added resource development is critical to the vitality and prosperity of our nation. Value-added resource development boosts local, regional, and national economies, and at the same time reduces risks to our natural environments. This is generally true for all natural resource industries such as oil and gas, forestry, mining, fisheries, and agriculture.

Adding value to natural resources attracts investment, delivers additional tax revenue, captures a greater percentage of the inherent economic value of each product, and preserves and creates both direct and indirect employment.

Adding value to natural resources often reduces environmental risks associated with transporting products, minimizes waste by utilizing a greater percentage of products, and ensures processing occurs under Canada's world class environmental regulations.

It is with these sentiments that Kitimat supports the Government of Canada's recent dismissal of the Enbridge Northern Gateway project, and supports a proposed crude oil tanker moratorium for the Northwest BC coast provided that the moratorium excludes refined products. Kitimat believes the environmental risks associated with tidewater shipping of crude oil outweigh potential economic benefits. Kitimat supports value-added opportunities across the nation that benefit our economy at the same time as reducing environmental risks, including proposed oil refineries and LNG terminals in the Kitimat region.

Refining and adding value to Canada's oil resources before export is a viable opportunity that

Kitimat views as the least controversial and best option to gain tidewater access to international markets from Canada's west coast.

Kitimat is supportive of these projects provided they are able to mitigate potential negative environmental impacts.

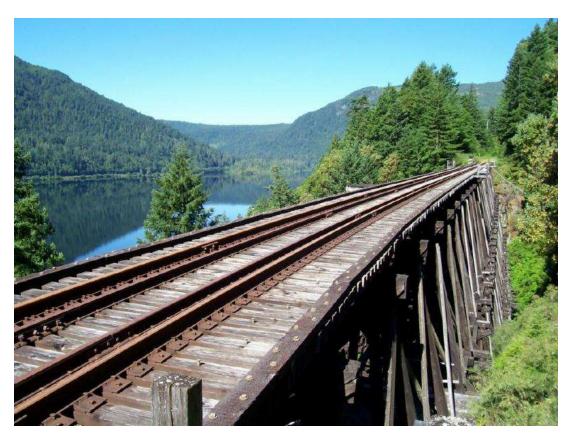
**Board Meeting Notes October 2016** 



#### **Alberni Sub Bridge Inspection Plan**

A plan for bridge inspections on the Alberni subdivision will be developed with the Alberni Pacific Railway (APR).

The APR already completes an annual bridge inspection for the three structures that the McLean Mill steam train crosses between the Mill and the Alberni Station. The BC Safety Authority has asked for the inspection on the full Alberni sub and has restricted any usage of the bridges until the report has been completed. Track maintenance volunteers have be informed that passage over the structures is forbidden.





#### **Community Input Sessions**

The general public and elected leaders will be able to offer input to the ICF on a number of occasions over the next several months. A second local government liaison meeting is to be organized for early in the new year followed with two community round table forums in late January and early February. Times and dates will be announced once facilities are confirmed. In early April an ICF workshop will be held at the annual conference of the Association of Vancouver Island and Coastal Communities.

The public is also invited to attend the ICF Annual General Meeting April 27 at the Nanaimo Conference Centre. Time and the agenda will be posted in March.



## **Business Plan Update**

Work will begin in December to update the ICF business plan and to review the rail strategic plan. Various items will be on the table for the round table forums such as trail development, station improvements and rail phases that will form part of the business plan.



#### **Director Skill Sets**

A subcommittee of the board has been struck to develop director skill sets for the ICF. The committee will review various skill set criteria used by other organizations in bringing forward a recommendation to the Board. The skill sets will take into account the unique First Nation and Regional membership of the ICF and the articles of the foundation.



### Federal Rail Safety Improvement Funding program (RSIP)

Staff will review what opportunities there are to improve rail safety on the corridor from the Wellcox Yard to Superior Propane at North Nanaimo that would match the requirements of this federal funding program. More information on this program will also be presented to local government officials at the local government advisory committee in January.

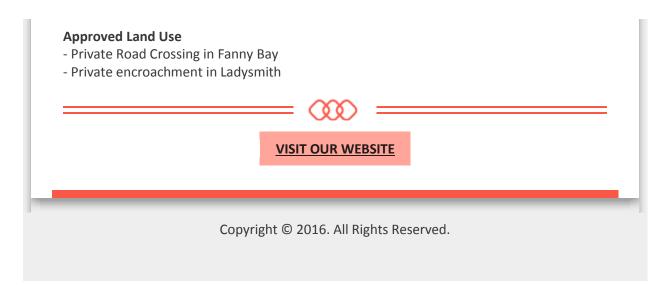

#### MAIN STREET 2.0 - TOFINO TO LAUNCH \$550K DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION

COURTENAY – The next phase of the District of Tofino's downtown revitalization will get underway in early January, rehabilitating the historic main street and restoring it as a viable and attractive location for business investment in the community and enhanced staging area for new tourism opportunities.

The \$533,000 project will receive an investment of \$117,000 from the Island Coastal Economic Trust.

"As Tofino has grown as a Resort Municipality, we've focused on building infrastructure that supports visitor experience, economic opportunity and business growth, and community life," said Tofino Mayor Josie Osborne. "Our phased approach to revitalize downtown Tofino has enabled us to build on past successes, leverage support, and maximize the benefits of revitalization."

Tofino is engaged in a multi-phase revitalization project, and the work supported by ICET in the first phase has generated tangible benefits, including new business startups, sale of key investment property and a significant increase in foot traffic contributing to increased profits for existing businesses. The Main Street project, expected to begin early in the new year will shift the focus to the historic commercial centre of town.

"Our investment focus is to provide project funding that spurs further sustainable economic activity, and downtown revitalizations are a proven strategy for doing just that," said ICET Chair Phil Kent. "This project helps Tofino put its best foot forward for the tens of thousands of visitors it attracts and functions as a catalyst to leverage new business investment."

The project will create a continuous pedestrian connection, leverage the natural and historic assets to strengthen the visitor connection to the waterfront and set the stage for the development of a scenic waterfront walkway, highlighting Tofino's working waterfront.

"The design will encourage visitors and residents to explore downtown Tofino from a new perspective," explained Osborne. "It will showcase our historic assets and highlight the connection to the harbour which is the jumping off point for First Nations communities, Meares Island Tribal Park and Clayoquot Sound, a UNESCO biosphere reserve."

Yesterday, the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) Chair Jean-Pierre Blais announced their decision in the Review of Basic Telecommunications Services.

The Review examined what telecommunications services should be deemed essential for Canadians to participate in the digital economy and the CRTC's decision responds directly to FCM's call for universal access to reliable broadband services across Canada. FCM issued <a href="mailto:this.statement">this.statement</a> in reaction to the decision, which we encourage you to share on social media.

The CRTC's decision lays the groundwork for improved access to high-speed broadband across rural and northern Canada by establishing:

- a new universal service objective so Canadians, in urban areas as well as in rural and remote areas, have access to voice and broadband Internet access services, on both fixed and mobile wireless networks;
- a fixed broadband Internet service criteria for all Canadian households and businesses, with an updated speed target of 50 mbps for downloads and 10 mbps for uploads and an unlimited data option, to better reflect technological advancements and changes in user needs. Fixed broadband Internet access service at these speeds should be available in 90% of Canadian homes and businesses by the end of 2021 and in the remaining 10% within 10-15 years;
- a new application-based funding mechanism for basic broadband access, with \$750 million in funding over the first five years and 10% of funding allocated to satellite-dependent communities in these first five years. The CRTC will initiate follow-up proceedings in early 2017 to examine design considerations for this new funding mechanism.

FCM has long advocated for increased federal involvement in developing the telecommunications infrastructure that is critical to the social and economic vibrancy of rural and northern Canada and has participated in every phase of this consultation, including the public hearing in May 2016. FCM's <u>final submission</u> to the <u>Review</u> called for universal access to affordable and reliable high-speed Internet and highlighted the significant barriers faced in both <u>rural</u> and <u>northern</u> communities.

The CRTC's decision was issued less than a week after Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada launched the federal government's <u>Connect to Innovate</u> program. First announced in Budget 2016, the new program will increase dedicated funding for high-speed broadband in rural and northern communities by investing \$500 million over five years. *Connect to Innovate* responds directly to FCM's advocacy by helping to reduce the traditional lag-time in improving broadband service in high-cost areas, while allowing for targeted investments to advance broadband access. FCM will continue to work with the federal government to confirm additional details for this program, including the process for project selection.

Broadband Internet access has become fundamental to modern life, and has the power to transform rural and northern Canada. Unfortunately, the "broadband gap" remains a reality in these rural and northern communities, as some are without broadband coverage while others remain underserved by bandwidth and network capacity that is insufficient to meet user demands. These steps provide a historic opportunity to continue developing a comprehensive, long-term plan for universal access to high-speed broadband. To realize this vision, we believe that all orders of government must work together. FCM is ready to partner with the CRTC and the federal government to turn this bold vision into meaningful action. In particular, we look forward to working with our federal partners to implement the positive changes announced in the decision and in particular on the design and roll-out of the CRTC's new funding mechanism and to ensure broadband services are affordable for all Canadians.

#### RE: BCAS DISPATCH PROTOCOLS TO HIGHLINE RD, D'ARCY, BC

On the night of the October 15th, 2016, there was a single vehicle accident at 4 km on south end of the Douglas Trail (Highline) Rd. that resulted in a fatality. There was intense rainfall in the area, and roads were wet and muddy. First responders, including BC Ambulance Service (BCAS) paramedics, responded with dedication and professionalism in very difficult circumstances, and the Board of the Squamish-Lillooet Regional District (SLRD) is grateful for their actions. However, the Board is left with concerns over how BCAS assets are deployed to the Highline Rd., and wishes to ensure that BCAS has the information required to make appropriate dispatch decisions based on knowledge of local conditions and geography.

The Highline Rd. is a stretch of Provincial highway that runs approximately 31 km from D'Arcy (SLRD Electoral Area C) to Seton Portage (SLRD Electoral Area B). It is a treacherous mountain road perched on the cliffs above Anderson Lake, one vehicle wide through many sections, and has a rough gravel surface with regular rock falls and washouts. The location of the October 15th accident, approximately 4 km north of D'Arcy, is characterized by steep grades and switchbacks with narrow creek crossings. The closest BCAS station to the accident scene is in Seton Portage, approximately 27 km away over the Highline Rd. The next most proximate station is 48 km away in Pemberton. Travel from the Pemberton station, however, is on paved blacktop. Despite the Seton Portage BCAS station being closest to the accident location, it is probable that a BCAS unit from Pemberton would have reached the scene sooner, given road conditions and weather. However, the Seton BCAS unit received the call and responded.

The SLRD Board requests that BCAS review its dispatch protocols with respect to the Highline Rd. and other rural areas in the province with similarly difficult terrain, and consider any required adjustments to those protocols to ensure that ambulance units are dispatched with consideration to travel time and road/weather conditions, as well as most proximate BCAS station.

The SLRD Board acknowledges the contribution that all first responders make to their communities, and is grateful for the service and dedication of BCAS paramedics during times of crisis. The Board appreciates your attention to and consideration of the issues raised above, and looks forward to a response from BCAS on this matter.

#### RE: VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENTS ON PRIVATE LAND

Society-operated volunteer fire departments (VFDs) have been an essential part of the public safety architecture in rural BC for over 70 years. Where it is impractical or unsustainable for local governments to provide fire protection services, these organizations have come together in small communities to provide a degree of structural fire protection not otherwise possible. In recent conversations with other regional districts throughout the province, the Squamish-Lillooet Regional District (SLRD) has recently been made aware of an issue that could affect the viability of society-operated VFDs.

Neither the current *Fire Services Act*, the new *Fire Safety Act* nor the *Local Government Act (LGA)* provides regional districts with the power to delegate the authority to enter onto private land to a society-operated VFD unless that society is created by the regional district. Specifically, under section 229(1) of the *LGA*, the ability of a regional district to delegate to a society or corporation is limited to delegations to a society or corporation created by the regional district; as such, a society-operate VFD that is not a function of/created by a regional district cannot take advantage of the statutory authority regarding right of entry under the *LGA*.

A society-operated VFD in another regional district reportedly recently raised this issue with their insurer. They were told that their liability insurance may be void if a claim were made against them with respect to their actions on private property and they did not have either delegated authority from the regional district or written permission of the property owner, to enter onto private land in the pursuit of their structural fire suppression duties. It is further inferred that WorkSafe BC coverage would also be void in the above circumstance.

The SLRD Board notes that society-operated VFDs pre-date the existence of regional districts in many rural areas. A brief consultation with SLRD legal counsel indicates that the right for a society-operated VFD to enter onto private land in the pursuit of structural fire suppression duties is most likely enshrined in common law. However, given that there may be insurers in the province

who are reconsidering how to apply liability protection to society-operated VFDs, the SLRD Board formally requests that:

- 1. The BC Office of the Fire Commissioner (OFC) step in and clarify that society-operated VFDs have the right to enter onto private land in the pursuit of their duties; and
- 2. The OFC legislate the right of society-operated VFDs to enter onto private land in the new *Fire Safety Act*.

In small, rural communities, society-operated VFDs are often at the heart of community volunteerism. These entities organize and focus on the desire to help a neighbour in an emergency. Without society-operated VFDs, many small communities would simply go without fire protection, as most regional districts have neither the resources nor the expertise to step in as the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) in all cases. The SLRD Board looks forward to the OFC guaranteeing through legislation, and communication to all stakeholders, that society-operated VFDs are an essential part of the first responder community in rural BC, and have the right to enter onto private land to complete their duties.

# PORT ALBERNI MARITIME HERITAGE SOCIETY ACRD Grant-in-Aid – 2016 REPORT CONCERNING USE OF GRANT FUNDS





**Project goal:** To design and construct an open sided building, next to the Maritime Gallery on the Lighthouse pier, to protect and display the 36-foot heritage wooden steamboat "*The Swan*". This vessel spent almost all its over 100 years of life in the ACRD area both on the Alberni Inlet and on Sproat Lake. This vessel which is probably not equalled anywhere in Canada must be preserved on land: it would be to expensive to keep it afloat.

#### **Project Summary:**

During 2016 the Port Alberni Maritime Heritage Society completed the construction of the open sided building to house the Swan. The building is of the highest professional standards and in appearance complements galleries. Most the construction work was completed by (often very qualified) volunteers. Our \$5,000 ACRD Grant in Aid for 2016 was applied to the total cash payments for materials and services of \$14,355.

Three hundred and sixty volunteer hours were contributed to the project representing a very significant commitment by members of the society and local volunteers. At Government Gaming rates the volunteer time was equivalent to approx. \$5,000, and at market rates equivalent to \$7,200.

In addition to our volunteers we received generous contributions of "in-kind" materials and services from local businesses and the McLean Mill to a total value of \$5,400. These figures show that this project has been supported by all sectors of the community.

**Partners:** The display of "*The Swan*" along with the other heritage vessel on the same site (our Boomboat "*Tatoosh*", a dugout canoe, and a planned wooden double-ender troller) is only possible with the help of our partners: The AV Museum; The Port Authority; the McLean Mill; ACRD and our local business community.

Use of ACRD funds: The funds requested from the ACRD was applied to the overall costs.

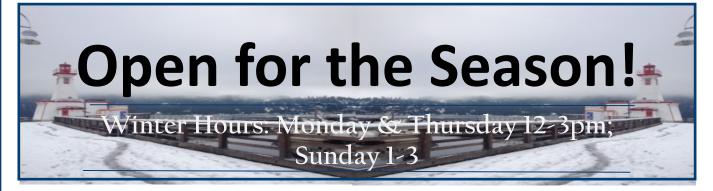

#### **Desired Outcome:**

# **Summary:**

Borrowing through the Municipal Finance Authority (MFA) of British Columbia up to a maximum of \$600,000 is authorized through "Bamfield Water System Treatment Plant Loan Authorization Bylaw No. F1126, 2016". During the construction phase there will be a need to borrow funds in the short term and then upon completion of the project the debenture will be secured with the Municipal Finance Authority over 20 years. This bylaw is the final step required to provide the Board of Directors the ability to proceed with the Bamfield Water System Treatment Plant borrowing.

# <u>Time Requirements – Staff & Elected Officials:</u>

Minimal staff time will be required to initiate borrowing.

#### **Financial:**

The short term borrowing will be done through the MFA in order to take advantage of the low short term borrowing rates. The current short term lending rate (at the time of writing) is 1.42%. Interest is calculated on the amounts borrowed and will be payable monthly. Funds are drawn down on an as needed basis in order to minimize borrowing costs.

# **Policy or Legislation:**

Section 409 of the Local Government Act permits the Board to adopt a temporary borrowing bylaw to access funds during the construction phase of a project. In order for this bylaw to be adopted it requires the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the votes cast. Temporarily borrowed funds must be repaid or transferred to long term debt within 5 years from the first advance.

# A BYLAW TO PROVIDE TEMPORARY BORROWING OF MONEY FOR THE BAMFIELD WATER SYSTEM TREATMENT PLANT

**WHEREAS** it is provided by section 409 of the *Local Government Act* that the Regional Board may, where it has adopted a loan authorization bylaw, without further assents or approvals, borrow temporarily from any person under the conditions therein set out;

**AND WHEREAS** the Regional Board has adopted Bylaw No. F1126, cited as "Bamfield Water System Treatment Plant Loan Authorization Bylaw No. F1126, 2016", authorizing the construction of a water treatment plant, in the amount of \$1,500,000 of which the sum of \$600,000 is the amount of debt intended to be borrowed;

AND WHEREAS the sale of debentures has been temporarily deferred;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Regional Board of the Regional District of Alberni-Clayoquot, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

- 1. The Regional Board is hereby empowered and authorized to borrow upon the credit of the Regional District an amount or amounts not exceeding the sum of \$600,000, as the same may be required.
- 2. The form of obligation to be given as acknowledgment of the liability shall be a promissory note or notes bearing the corporate seal and signed by the Chairperson and the Financial Administration Officer.
- The money so borrowed shall be used solely for the purposes set out in said Bylaw No. F1126, cited as "Bamfield Water System Treatment Plant Loan Authorization Bylaw No. F1126, 2016".
- 4. The proceeds from the sale of debentures or so much thereof as may be necessary shall be used to repay the money so borrowed.
- 5. This Bylaw may be cited as "Bamfield Water System Treatment Plant Temporary Borrowing Bylaw No. F1129, 2017".

- 2. The form of obligation to be given as acknowledgment of the liability shall be a promissory note or notes bearing the corporate seal and signed by the Chairperson and the Financial Administration Officer.
- 3. All anticipated revenue of the current year or so much thereof as may be necessary shall, when collected, be used to repay the money so borrowed.
- 4. This Bylaw may be cited as "Revenue Anticipation Borrowing Bylaw No. F1128, 2017".

The assessment would also be used in developing an Asset Management Plan for the service.

#### Time Requirements – Staff & Elected Officials:

There would be a limited amount of staff time required to complete the grant application form. The intake deadline is February 1, 2017. If awarded the grant funding and the project were to proceed the majority of the work would be performed by McGill and Associates and therefore the amount of time required by staff would be fairly minimal.

#### **Financial:**

A cost estimate provided by McGill and Associates to perform this assessment is within the \$10,000 grant amount.

The Province will provide a maximum grant of \$10,000 using the following formula:

- 1. 100% of approved costs for the first \$5,000
- 2. 50% of approved costs for the next \$10,000

Matching funds, if required, will come from the Millstream Water System capital reserve fund.

#### **Recommendation:**

THAT the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District Board of Directors accept a bid of \$69,999 before tax from Viking Fire Protection Inc. for a fully monitored automatic sprinkler system at the  $3^{rd}$  Avenue Recycling Depot.

#### **Summary:**

Our Recycling Depot requires upgrades to facilitate conformance with health and safety regulations, to protect the public, to provide longevity for the depot and associated employment and to extend services to our community. These upgrades include an automated fire suppression system, storage and bathroom upgrades, structural upgrades, fencing and expansion of the area and specially designed areas for the storage of materials/chemicals that have potential risks.

The ACRD has grant funding through Western Economic Diversification Canada and the Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program; the Depot can utilize up to \$55,100 from the Program. The accepted proposal requires an electrically supervised automated sprinkler system to be installed throughout the building prior to March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017. This Request for Decision covers the automated sprinkler system; there is a separate Request for Quotation process for the electrical supervision of the system to help reduce overall project costs.

Three bids were received via formal request for quotations process as outlined within the ACRD purchasing policy; the request was posted province wide for three weeks and included in BC Bid online.

Company references, letters of good standing through Worker's Compensation Board and B.C. Construction Safety Association, past and current projects, suppliers, contractors and company personnel were all taken into consideration, as well as liability insurances, bid bonds, performance bonds and other contractual requirements of the Tender process.

After review of all bids received the ACRD Building Inspector/Property Maintenance Coordinator elects Viking Fire Protection Incorporated as the most qualified to meet our requirements. The following bids were received:

Viking Fire Protection Inc.	\$69,999
Mount Benson Mechanical 1991 Ltd.	\$84,300
Troy Life and Fire Safety	\$92,700

# <u>Time Requirements – Staff & Elected Officials:</u>

Considerable staff time will be required over the next two months as ACRD is managing the project. This may include alternating two staff members within or up to 4 hours on average per week.

#### Financial:

The Alberni Valley and Bamfield Service Committee at the October 5, 2016 meeting endorsed the capital budget of \$160,000 for the 2017-2021 Capital plan for the Alberni Valley waste service budget. In 2016 there was \$140,000 approved for depot improvements. These amounts are required and any amounts unspent from these funds will be requested to be brought forward. The ACRD has received grants totaling \$55,100 from Canada 150 for capital improvements, these works are required to be complete by March 31, 2017.

The Sprinkler system has been in the capital budget since 2015 and a portion of the cost is covered through the Canada 150 grant funds.

An automated fire suppression system is a necessary upgrade to the Recycle Depot located at 3620 Third Avenue via Port Alberni Fire Department annual inspection. The Request for Quotation covers only the electrical supervision aspect of the overall sprinkler system installation and includes all items required by B.C. Building and Fire Code and other applicable/referenced standards. Please refer to the original Request for Quotation, attached.

Two bids were received via Request for Quotation process outlined in the ACRD purchasing policy. Companies were provided three weeks to submit their quotations.

Viking Fire Protection Inc.\$12 350.00 with sprinkler tender awardedViking Fire Protection Inc.\$12 850.00 without sprinkler tender awardedMazzei Electric\$16 120

The quotation from Viking Fire Protection Inc. provides a detailed materials list, equipment and rental costs, time/labor cost estimates, and required documentation to be submitted prior to verification of the system. This estimate was the superior of the two and was \$3,370.00 cheaper when applying the \$500.00 coordination discount if Viking is awarded the sprinkler installation.

After review of all bids received the ACRD Building Inspector/Property Maintenance Coordinator elects Viking Fire Protection Incorporated as the most qualified to meet our requirements.

#### Time Requirements - Staff & Elected Officials:

Minimal staff time will be required.

# Financial:

The Alberni Valley and Bamfield Service Committee at the October 5, 2016 meeting endorsed the capital budget of \$160,000 for the 2017-2021 Capital plan for the Alberni Valley waste service budget. In 2016 there was \$140,000 approved for 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue Recycling Depot improvements. These amounts are required and any amounts unspent from these funds will be requested to be brought forward in addition to the \$160,000 planned for 2017. The ACRD has received grants totaling \$55,100 from Canada 150 for capital improvements, these works are required to be complete by March 31, 2017.

The Sprinkler system has been in the capital budget since 2015 and a portion of the cost is covered through the Canada 150 grant funds.

In accordance with the ACRD purchasing policy, amounts over \$35,000 require Board approval. (if combined with the sprinkler system install).

In addition to daily activities, the Administration Department has been working on the following for the month of December 2016/January 2017:

#### Alberni Valley Regional Airport Runway Expansion Project

Staff, D.R. Clough Consulting, Lewkowich Engineering and Bowerman contracting continue to work to improve the water quality discharge from the airport earth works.

In November (2) clay laden ditch lines were armored with filter cloth and blast rock greatly reducing the fine sediment discharge from the circuit one location.

The contractor has instituted a water quality-monitoring program, with special inspections both pre and post rain events. The water discharged from the airport site has shown a marked improvement over the last month and a half.

Obstacle Limitation Surfaces (OLS) intrusions outside the airport boundaries have been developed utilizing LIDAR data. The intrusions identification will assist FLNR in protecting the approach surfaces footprint both East and West of the runway.

The NW industrial road realignment tender process will begin in late January with an anticipated completion of February 22, 2017. A favorable proposal and contractor schedule will determine the projects start date.

# **Bamfield Water System Treatment Plant Project**

At the December 9<sup>th</sup> meeting the Board of Directors awarded the contract for the Bamfield Water System Treatment Plant Project to ADI Water Solutions for a total cost of \$551,250 subject to receiving a Certificate of Approval from the Ministry of Community, Sport and Cultural Development. The Regional District received the Certificate of Approval on December 21, 2016 and awarded the contract. The project is now proceeding.

# **Proposed West Coast Multiplex Facility**

Staff continue to work with the West Coast Multiplex Society (WCMS) and the Tla-o-qui-aht First Nation on the next steps for the multiplex facility on the west coast. Peter MacLeod, Rec Excellence presented the draft business plan for phase one of the multiplex project on December 12, 2016 at the Long Beach Golf Course Clubhouse. The West Coast Committee will be meeting on January 12<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 pm in Tofino to discuss options for moving forward with the project. Following that meeting, the West Coast Committee will meet with the WCMS and TFN representatives on January 26<sup>th</sup>, 3:00 pm in Ucluelet to discuss next steps.

# **Board Strategy Session**

Managers are following up. The Consultants report is being finalized and Board priorities reflected in the financial plan. The final report will be presented for endorsement by the Board at the January 25<sup>th</sup> meeting. A number of changes to updates and reports are being implemented and will be reflected in Board and Committee agendas.

# **Committee for Appointment of Fire Chiefs**

Dan Holder, Emergency/Fire Services Coordinator is working with staff to arrange a meeting of the Special Committee that was formed by the ACRD Board with the purpose of bringing forward recommendations on appointment of fire chiefs and officers of the Regional Districts volunteer fire departments. The CAO and Fire Services Coordinator have met with the three fire chiefs and three directors for initial input.

# **ACRD Procedures Bylaw Amendments**

The Manager of Administrative Services is working on amendments to the ACRD Procedures Bylaw for consideration by the Board in January 2017. Amendments are required to reflect changes in the *Local Government Act*. Section 215 of the *Local Government Act* now states that election of Chair and Vice Chair of the Board is to be held at the first meeting after November 1<sup>st</sup> in each year. A review of how late items are introduced or considered is also being reviewed. Some changes will be proposed based on the Board's strategy session.

# **West Coast Emergency Planning**

The Chief Administrative Officer arranged and participated in a meeting on Monday, November 28<sup>th</sup> in Ucluelet with community leaders, EMBC, Parks Canada and emergency coordinators on the West Coast to develop a plan for improved coordination of emergency response. A report is forthcoming that will look at improved cooperation and possibly a role for the regional district throughout 2017. A request for funding for 2017 has been sent to the 8 communities and Parks Canada. The response will be reflected in preliminary budget discussions.

#### 2017 – 2021 Financial Planning Process

The CAO and senior staff are preparing preliminary budgets, consulting with staff, directors and relevant interests. Communities meetings have been scheduled for three electoral areas.

#### **2017 Committee Appointments**

The Manager of Administrative Services is working in conjunction with the CAO and ACRD Chairperson to update appointments to Committees, Commissions and other agencies. The appointments will be presented for approval by the ACRD Board at the January 25<sup>th</sup> Board meeting. Preparation is beginning to review procedures and practices will all Committees and Commissions in 2017.

# **Board Reporting**

Based on the input from the Board at the Strategy Session, the format for future staff reports to the Board will be changing next month.

The development of the 2017-2021 Financial Plan was driven by a focus on meeting the service standards our Board has committed to. Specifically the 2017-2021 Financial Plan focuses on:

- Evaluating budget pressures within the framework of the Strategic Plan and the Facilities Master Plan;
- Reinforcing strategic priorities through the business case planning process;
- Exploring alternative funding sources;
- Continuous evolution of the internal request for funding process; and

Strong Libraries Strong Communities



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Exploring opportunities & continuous improvement.

The objective of these actions is to provide a budget that is lean while maintaining the Board's service levels.

For 2017 this entails a 4.25% increase in the total levy, consisting of:

- A 1.34% increase to meet our core service needs and inflationary pressures;
- A 1.72% increase for staff-driven business cases to improve our services to the public; and
- A 1.19% increase for levies related to the Facilities Master Plan

The 2017 - 2021 Financial Plan plays an integral part in meeting the objectives of the Strategic Plan:

- **1. Community:** VIRL will continue to expand engagement and partnership opportunities, as well as increase advertising and promotion to show that the library is a vibrant, welcoming place for people of all socioeconomic groups, cultures and literacy levels.
- **2. Collect. Connect. Collaborate. Create:** VIRL seeks to identify and address the educational and recreational needs of our customers. As well, we seek new ways to reach those who are not aware of the resources we have to offer.

The library is a place of lifelong learning and inspiration. We strive to provide our communities with access to the information they need – whenever or wherever that may be.

**3. Places & Spaces:** Since 2011, we have renovated or built eleven branches across the VIRL service area. Assessing the needs of each unique community when renovating and building facilities is a crucial component of our ongoing success.

In addition, our online presence and information technology (IT) infrastructure needs continuous and consistent stewardship and development to ensure that we meet the current and future technological needs of our customers.

**4. Life at Work:** To succeed as an organization, VIRL recognizes that it needs to support staff (and ultimately library customers) by respecting the multiple perspectives our employees represent. To do this, we must continually promote positive employer/union
