g. Other Reports - Chairperson

Following on a November 2016 recommendation of the RHD, Director Osborne met with Marie Dupperreault (Director) and Wendy Johnsen (Medical Director) at West Coast General Hospital to discuss Island Health's End of Life Program in the region and more specifically, funding and future plans for additional hospice beds in the Health Authority's jurisdiction. The various considerations in developing Island Health's EOL program were discussed. With Ty Watson House, a stand-alone four-bed hospice facility, the Alberni Valley and area is relatively well-supported in comparison to other locations on Vancouver Island. Island Health uses a demographic approach to allocate funding, and remaining funding for the addition of 11 beds in the Island Health area in 2019/2020 are most likely to be allocated elsewhere. Additional options, such as private beds and increased support to enable those who choose to die at home, were also discussed.





Thank you for your letter of February 2, 2017 to Dr. Brendan Carr asking that Island Health provide technical expertise to evaluate an option for a floating helipad at the Bamfield Health Centre. Dr. Carr has asked that I respond on his behalf. I apologize for the delay in responding.

In July 2016, Island Health responded to a similar enquiry from the Regional Hospital District regarding development of a floating helipad (see attached letter). Although the floating helipad was identified as one of two viable alternatives in a February 2016 report, Island Health does not have plans to pursue this option. Island Health provides helipads at our acute care hospital sites with the exception where we have inherited one from a predecessor organization.

We recognize the value of a helipad in Bamfield given its remoteness and lack of a BC Ambulance Station for provision of everyday ground transportation service locally. Island Health staff have contacted the BC Emergency Health Services and are encouraged by the availability of a helicopter landing area at the private airstrip and development of a first responder program that exists in similar remote communities. If you have not already, I would encourage you to connect with Blaine Wiggins of the BC Emergency Health Services (blaine.wiggins@bcehs.ca) to further these discussions.

Once again, thank you for your letter.

Dear Penny Cote:

Thank you for your letter of May 2, 2016 on behalf of the Alberni Clayoguot Regional Hospital District regarding locating a new helipad at the Bamfield Health Centre. I appreciate receiving your input. The safe and timely transfer of patients is important to local residents and to Island Health.

In the fall of 2015, Transport Canada ruled that the helicopter landing area next to the Health Centre was considered to be in a built-up area and was therefore subject to regulation. In response, various alternatives were investigated to address the need for emergency air evacuation from Bamfield. The two main alternatives identified are the use of a private airstrip located 1.7 kilometres from the Health Centre and construction of a floating heliport at the Health Centre.

The owner of the airstrip, the Huu-ay-aht First Nation, supports the use of a helicopter landing area at the airstrip. To address patient transfer to the airstrip, a first responder program is being put in place with training already completed. In addition, BC Ambulance Services has indicated its willingness to supply the first responders with a decommissioned ambulance and additional training. Although some agreements still need to be completed, this alternative has made good progess.

The second alternative, as you have recommended, is the development of a floating heliport on a new dock at the Health Centre. In more remote areas throughout BC, some local communities have chosen to make helicopter landing areas available for air ambulance transfers. While Island Health has helicopter landing areas on its property in a few remote areas, these are an exception. I understand that the floating heliport is your preferred option; however, Island Health is focusing its investment on heliports at its hospital sites and, as a result, will not be proceeding with this project.

I appreciate the interest of the Alberni Clayoquot Regional Hospital District in this matter and once again thank you for writing.

Dear Ms. Osborne:

Thank you for your letter of April 19, 2017, regarding ambulance service in Bamfield. I am pleased to respond on behalf of the Ministry of Health, and I apologize for the delay in communication.

The Ministry of Health and British Columbia Emergency Health Services (BCEHS) recognize the importance of appropriate emergency care in rural and remote communities. BCEHS uses a risk management service delivery analysis to determine where ambulance stations should be placed. While their analysis has not indicated a need for a station in Bamfield at this time, BCEHS is developing strategies to improve resourcing and deployment models and is systematically looking at opportunities where it can improve patient care delivery.

I understand this work has included collaboration with representatives from Bamfield, the Huu-ay-aht First Nations, and your organization to address service concerns and opportunities to improve patient care response in the local area. While the majority of patient transports are by ground, BCEHS does employ air resources when available and appropriate, which is consistent with BCEHS operations across the province in rural and remote areas.

I encourage you to contact Mr. Blaine Wiggins, Manager (Interim), First Responder and First Nations Liaison, BCEHS, about this issue. Mr. Wiggins can be reached by telephone at 250 267-4871 or by email at blaine.wiggins@bcehs.ca. I understand that Mr. Wiggins will be attending an in-person meeting with the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District on May 24, 2017. I trust that this meeting will provide you with the opportunity to bring forward your feedback.
