Subject: Build Canada Small Communities Fund unsuccessful application

The successful filtration treatment plant trial in the winter of 2014 provided great improvements to water quality for the residents of Bamfield. The trial project was undertaken in order provide a system process to meet the Canadian Drinking water standards. The Bamfield water committee has provided the support of this project and the Board of Directors are committed to improving the water quality in Bamfield.

The unsuccessful application of the Build Canada Small Communities Fund and the ability of the residents of Bamfield to pay for the treatment plant are well understood by staff and the Board of Directors. The ACRD will be investigate other possible grant and reapply for the next intake for the Build Canada Small Communities Fund.

The other options available:

- 1) <u>Short Term Borrowing (MFA)</u> –may borrow for 5 years or less for any purpose of a capital nature. The borrowing must be undertaken by bylaw approved by the Inspector. There is no requirement for elector approval to the bylaw. (Provide examples of impact at meeting).
- 2) <u>Long Term Borrowing (MFA)</u> All long term borrowing must be undertaken through adoption of a loan authorization bylaw approved by the Inspector of Municipalities. The maximum term of the debt is the lesser of 30 years or the reasonable life expectancy of the capital asset or the term of any related agreement.
- 3) Other grants ACRD staff will look for other opportunities to access grant funding at both the Federal and Provincial levels. There is currently \$425,000 in gas tax funds awaiting allocation for Bamfield and if the opportunity for a project that is eligible for stacking is found we can combine the two funding sources.
- 4) Next Build Canada Small Communities fund ACRD staff will review submission and reapply at the next intake.
