Essential service industries in BC:







COMMUNITY HEALTH & SAFETY SERVICES

Community Animal Management is Unjustly a Disproportionate Social Determinant of Human Health in Indigenous Communities.

Statistics tell us that the most likely person to be bitten by a dog in Canada is a 5–9-year-old child living in an Indigenous community.

They are most likely to be bitten on their face, between 4–8pm, on a Saturday, during the summer, by a dog they are not engaging with.

CARE Network, with its community partners, network of animal-related service providers, and academic research supports is working to end this inequitable health crisis.

Local Impacts: CBT Vital Signs Report (2016)

Raising the level of **pet-care awareness** believed to lower the number of animals showing aggressive behaviour. The CARE Network in partnership with Ahousaht First Nation and animal welfare organizations, has held animal care clinics in Ahousaht to provide veterinary services and education on pet care and health. This project helped to increase the number of Ahousaht youth who feel safe in their community.

In the 2016 CBT Youth Survey, the number of youth who reported they felt unsafe walking alone in areas on the west coast (mostly due to aggressive dogs).⁶⁹




We Are An Invested Tenant

- Initiated the lease in 2019 with a 3-year term, non-surveyed on a small patch of land recommended by the Airport Manager due to it not being suitable to another potential lessee
- Volunteers removed dozens of alder trees, dug trenches and removed decades of garbage and debris
- Purchased two 'ATCO' trailers to use while sorting out leasing and renovating the Officer's Mess
- Started with only solar power and rainwater storage
- Developed a Statement of Significance & Conservation Plan that is endorsed by Heritage BC
- Being located at the airport is beneficial, especially when we need a volunteer pilot to help with an emergency or during tsunami evacuations

Our Proposal:

Adjust CARE Network's lease rate back to the original \$2,400 rate that was agreed upon based on the non-profit services that we provide to communities in the region.





Other Ideas to Discuss:

- Harness Economies of Scale: Establish a Regional Community Animal Management Service
- Renovating the Officer's Mess: taking it from a \$250K liability to a \$1M asset
- Develop a West Coast Public Dog Park
