Pacific Traverse Trail Project Pacific Rim National Park Reserve

Ucluelet, BC, June 13, 2017

Parks Canada is hosting four public information sessions on the new multi-use trail in Pacific Rim National Park Reserve in June.

Construction of the new multi-use trail began on February 15, 2017. Work started at Radar Hill on the north end of the park reserve and is moving south toward Incinerator Rock parking area. Starting the work in this area allows contractors to work in a section of the trail that will eventually connect several of the park reserve's attractions. This area also allows us greater flexibility to modify construction activities if we encounter unexpected challenges, and to increase our knowledge and experience to the benefit of the park reserve, environment, and visitors.

To learn more about the project, community members and park reserve visitors are invited to attend one of the public information sessions listed below. The sessions will include a short presentation, displays, and the opportunity to talk about the project with the Parks Canada team. Parks Canada is very excited about this project and the benefits the trail will bring to local residents, the local economy, and to visitors enjoying the area.
