

# Status Update – Mount Underwood Wildfire and Franklin River Road closure



**Date:** October 3, 2025

## Background

On August 11, 2025, a wildfire ignited on Mount Underwood near China Creek Marina. The fire burned rapidly upslope, causing considerable damage. As a result of the fire Franklin River Road (Bamfield Main Road) was closed. Although the wildfire is still burning, it is not projected to spread beyond the current perimeter. It is classified as **Under Control** and remains at 3,518 hectares. A 1.5-kilometer section of the Bamfield Main Road remains closed at least until the end of October because of slope instability related to damage from the fire.

## Updates

### Mount Underwood Wildfire: No update

- BCWS continues to work in this area and remain focused on mop up efforts as some areas continue to smoulder and burn.
- The crew is asking people travelling to China Creek, by Franklin River Road, to drive with caution as they are working along the roadway.

### Franklin River Road closure:

- The Ministry of Transportation and Transit (MOTT) continues to lead efforts to safely re-open Bamfield Main Road, in co-operation with Mosaic Forest Management. This includes plans for managing debris fall as we enter the winter months.
- Subject to weather conditions, MOTT are still on track to have the work completed by the end of October – [Work underway to re-open Bamfield Main Road by end of October](#)
- Recently, there has been public commentary suggesting that industry vehicles are being permitted to travel through the Franklin River Road (Bamfield Main Road) closure, while residents are denied the same access, forcing them to take an alternate route that adds several hours to their travel for essential services in Port Alberni. It is important that this matter be clarified.
  - The road permit area currently managed by the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District (ACRD) applies *only to a 1.5 km section of Bamfield Main Road*, specifically between the 8.5 km and 10 km road markers. Outside of this section, permitting requirements may fall under other jurisdictions, including Mosaic, as the private landowner in those areas. Those areas and the related road closures are not covered under the ACRD's Evacuation Order and therefore, the ACRD does not issue permits for them.

sources that can provide accurate information as we navigate these challenging road access issues together.

- Ditidaht First Nation has issued a media release on October 1 to provide clarification on access to Bamfield Main Road and jurisdictional complexity.
- A 1.5-kilometre stretch of Franklin River Road (Bamfield Main Road), between kilometre 8 and kilometre 9.5, remains closed due to unstable slopes affected by fire.
- MOTT is working on the procurement and installation of road closure gates that will be used at pre-established closure points that allow for vehicles to turn around in the event the road needs to be proactively closed
- MOTT continues its work on improving signage and road base and road surface repairs following the completion of the danger tree falling activities
- MOTT will be adding a weather station in the area to help inform future closures based on weather conditions.
- MOTT is committed to offering further updates and information about how the road will continue to be closely monitored over the winter and the re-opening/pre-emptive closure protocols will be provided in the coming weeks.

## **Geotechnical assessment:**

- A geotechnical assessment has been completed to identify hazard risks.
- Based on these findings, MOTT is developing an operating guideline, like the approach at Cameron Lake, that will establish rain and wind thresholds for increased patrols and potential pre-emptive closures.
- Assessments and removal of dangerous trees are ongoing, and MOTT is co-ordinating tree falling and related utility work with Telus and BC Hydro.

## **Youbou route:** No update

- Ditidaht First Nation issued a media release on October 1, that calls upon the Province of British Columbia to take immediate and decisive action to designate and maintain the Alternate Route for the safety, well-being, and resiliency of all who live, work, and travel within the Alberni Valley and West Coast communities.
- Ditidaht is working with MOTT on the development and placement of signage.
- Ditidaht continues to maintain the road with support from MOTT.
- This route is the only available alternate route.

## **Emergency Operations Centre: No update**

- The ACRD continues to operate an Emergency Operations Centre under a State of Local Emergency with an evacuation order in place for KM7 to KM10.
- The Ministry of Jobs and Economic Growth (JEG) is leading a Business Recovery Working Group to understand the economic impacts, share resources, identify ongoing needs, and develop a strategy to support local businesses.
- The Ministry of Emergency Management and Climate Readiness (EMCR) Recovery Unit is leading a Community Recovery Working Group to help support and address ongoing health, wellness and residential needs. A Post Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA) has been completed to reflect these concerns.
- The ACRD EOC continues to participate in a Franklin River Road Working Group, which collaborates on concerns and work related to road safety and restoration.
