

Appliances that can be changed-out to a certified wood stove under this program include the following:

- A free-standing non-EPA-certified "stove" - a "homemade" or "barrel" stove
- A so-called "airtight" non-EPA-certified fireplace insert, or tube-type heat exchanger with a face plate and door (like the "Free Heat Machine" or "Welenco") that is currently installed in an open-hearth fireplace
- A non-EPA-certified "wood furnace" (ducted, forced-air, home heating appliance)
- A wood-burning cookstove
- An outdoor wood boiler

If changing to an alternate fuel source, your wood stove must be a minimum of seven years old (pre-2016).

Note: Some store models and promotions may not apply. This is up to the discretion of the participating retailer.

The 2023 **Community Wood Smoke Reduction Program** operates on a first come, first served basis. Once all funding is utilized this program will be finished for the remainder of the year.

SMARTER BURNING CLEANER LIVING

Exchange any wood stove older than seven years (pre-2016) for a cleaner burning fuel source (pellet, electric heat pump) and save between \$1,000 to \$2,000.

Exchange your old, uncertified wood stove (pre-1994) for a new CSA-EPA emissions certified wood stove and save \$1,000.

Remove non-EPA or CSA certified wood stove without replacing and save \$300.

1. CHECK IF YOU ARE ELIGIBLE:

- Applicants must be the registered owner of legal dwelling units on First Nation land within the boundaries of the Alberni Clayoquot Regional District.
- The home on the property has a wood burning appliance that is regularly used as the home's heat source. Three incentives are available:
 - 1) People upgrading a certified wood stove can only switch to an electric heat pump, electric insert, or pellet fueled appliance. Stove must be a minimum of 7 years old (2016 or earlier). The old wood stove must be removed, decommissioned, and recycled (It cannot be reused in a workshop or garage and the landfill must sign off on your voucher).
 - 2) For exchange to a new wood burning appliance, the existing wood burning appliance must be non-EPA certified (manufactured prior to 1994).
 - 3) Remove existing non-EPA or CSA certified wood appliance without installing a new heating appliance (must be taken to Alberni Valley or West Coast Landfill and the landfill must sign voucher).
- All work must be done in compliance with local code requirements.

3. RETAILER DISCOUNT AND INSTALLATION

Choose your new heating appliance. Contact one of the participating retailers to arrange purchase.

Once rebate eligibility is verified, **the retailer will provide you with you an additional \$150 discount upon purchase of wood stove or \$300 discount for a pellet stove or heat pump. (This is in addition to the ACRD rebate).**

The retailer will contact the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District to obtain a tracking number that will secure your rebate with the ACRD, if you complete and submit within 90 days from the date of issue. This tracking number will be used to verify the purchase and installation of your new heating appliance, as well as verify the recycling of your old woodstove. The retailer will assist you with your rebate application.

1. DISPOSAL OF THE OLD STOVE

Your old stove must be taken to the Alberni Valley Sort'nGo Centre (formerly the Alberni Valley Landfill) or West Coast Landfill to be recycled if exchanging woodstove to woodstove (whether by you or the installer). Landfill staff will verify receipt of your old stove by signing the voucher.

2. RECEIVE YOUR REBATE

Once your participating retailer submits the completed voucher, a cheque for reimbursement will be mailed to you. Please ensure that the address, including the postal code, is correct on the voucher. This is the address to which your rebate cheque will be sent.
