ACRD moves forward with Log Train Trail updates

PORT ALBERNI – The Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District (ACRD) is pleased to announce the Board of Directors has approved an updated agreement with the Province of British Columbia for the management of the Log Train Trail.

“This has been a long process with a lot of engagement and input to consider from both sides of the conversation,” explains John Jack, Chair of the ACRD Board of Directors. “Updating the agreement reflects the input we’ve received and provides greater clarity for trail users, helping everyone understand how we can continue to share and enjoy this valued community asset.”

With this agreement in place, staff can begin implementing the next phase of the Log Train Trail Management Plan.

The approved framework introduces permitted recreational motorized vehicle use on the northern portion of the Log Train Trail corridor and maintains the southern portion as a non-motorized trail.

The approach is intended to recognize the different ways the corridor is used while providing clear direction for trail users.

To support the transition, the ACRD will begin a phased implementation program that includes public information, installation of new signage, updates to trailhead information, and improvements at key trail access points.

Implementation is expected to begin in summer 2026. Additional information regarding the transition, including maps, signage, and implementation timelines, will be shared as work progresses.
